Although this permit is good until March 1 I must return to USA within six months of sailing. Otherwise my application for citizenship will lapse. The only exception is very strong and compulsive reasons. Even then the Naturalization Court will interpret whether they regard the reasons as being such. However, I can enter anytime until March 1949, it is only the first papers that would suffer.

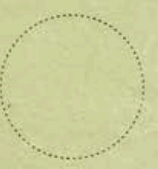

DR PAUL BRUNTON

Paul Brunton was born in London in 1898. He was educated in London and Chicago and took his degree in Greek Philosophy. He contributed articles to some of the important scientific and literary journals for many years before his travels took him to many countries of the world, including India, Tibet, Japan, China, Egypt and Mexico.

He has specialised in research into the subject of Yoga, which carried him all over India. He lived in the ashrams and monasteries of holy men, studied their highest philosophy with the learned pundits, and practised meditation until he became sufficiently expert in the art to write THE SECRET PATH.

The late Maharajah of Mysore put unusual facilities at his disposal to promote his research. The High Priest of Thailand presented him with a testimonial and his personal statue of the Buddha. Prince Mussoree of Nepal wrote of him as being a channel for the half-lost wisdom of the East.

My name is PAUL BRUNTON. I was born in London, England, on 27 November 1898.
My nationality is British; the passport number is C 608072; it is valid until 1978.

My father's name was Rubin Isaac Hurst (he died in London 1840). My mother's name was Fanny Kossow (she died in London 1911). To explain the change of name: in my profession as a writer I used the nom de plume, Paul Brunton, and eventually continued it as the legal name by Deed, inscribed at Court of Judicature, London. I had no brothers and no sisters.

I was educated at Central Foundation Secondary School, London; in evening classes at St. George's College, London; by correspondence study courses with McKinley-Roosevelt College, Chicago; and by private tutors. I got a doctorate of philosophy.

My first marriage was to Karen Augusta Tottrup in 1922, but we divorced in 1928. I continued researches in India for several years and then lived in U.S.A. for several years.

I went to Australia in 1960 and my last place of domicile was Auckland, New Zealand. In 1964 I returned to Europe to seek a place for permanent retirement for the rest of my life as I was then more than 65 years old. 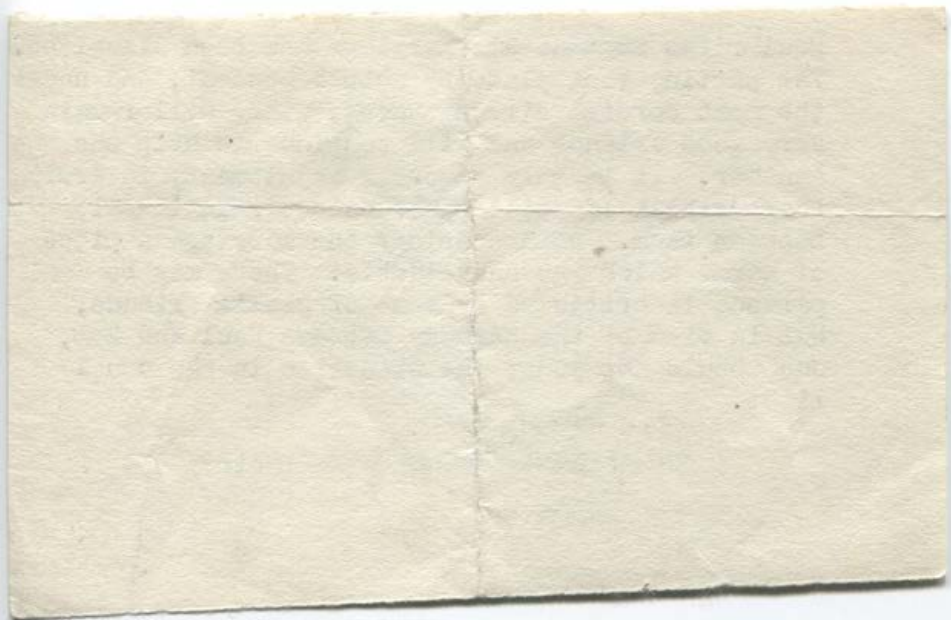

After some free lance journalism, he accepted the editorship of *World Trade*. Later he served as editor of a travel journal, and as managing editor of *Success Magazine*, an inspirational periodical for young men.

Abandoning his journalistic career to devote himself to full-time investigation and experiment in psychology and mysticism, Mr. Brunton visited Egypt, Ceylon, India and Burma. There he studied the ideas and practices of the Yogas, fakirs and holy men, and was the first white man to penetrate some of their secret hermitages. He was also initiated into many of their secrets and admitted as a member of some of their strange fraternities. On his return to England, Mr. Brunton settled in a quiet Buckinghamshire village and wrote *A SEARCH IN SECRET INDIA*. The book went into several editions in just a few months and he received so many letters asking for a system of thought control and spiritual help that he wrote *THE SECRET PATH*.

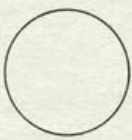

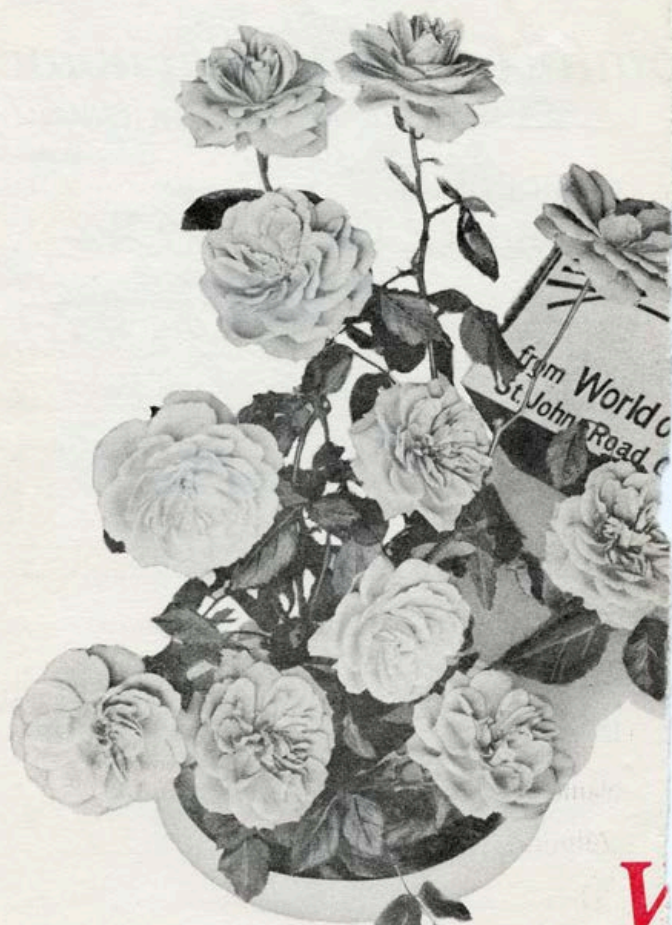

18th (Service) Battalion The Northumberland Fusiliers (1st Tyneside Pioneers)

In the Great War the Durham Light Infantry was to field 37 battalions, and 12,606 members of the regiment were killed or died of wounds.

The 1st Battalion served throughout the war in India, largely on the North West frontier. The 2nd Battalion served in France from 1914 and particularly distinguished itself at Hooze on 9th August 1915. The 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th and 9th Battalions sailed for France in April 1915 and fought with immense courage throughout the campaign. Thirteen service battalions of the Regiment were raised, numbered 10th to 23rd, the 18th being the only one raised and equipped at no expense to the nation, served in France and Egypt. The 12th, 13th and 20th served in France and Italy, and others at Archangel and in Macedonia.

Between the wars the 1st Battalion served in Germany, Silesia, England, Northern Ireland and China. The 2nd Battalion served in Turkey, India, China, the Sudan and England. The 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th and 9th Battalions continued until 1936 when the 7th converted to the anti-aircraft role and the 5th became a searchlight regiment. In the Second World War the regiment fielded eighteen battalions. The 1st Battalion fought in the Western Desert, the Mediterranean and Italy. The 2nd Battalion, after commitment in the withdrawal through Dunkirk, joined the 14th Army in Burma, fighting with great gallantry at Kohima. Six battalions of the Regiment were in France in 1940 and shortly after D Day five battalions of the

Regiment were in the line in Normandy together. Battalions fought at Knightsbridge, El Alamein, Mareth, Mersa Matruh, Sicily, Primosole Bridge, Rauray, Salerno and Camino.

At the end of the war the 1st Battalion, then in Italy, moved to Greece in 1946. The 2nd Battalion served first in India and then Malaya. The 1st and 2nd Battalions amalgamated on 1st September 1948 to become a new 1st Battalion which moved to Germany in 1949 and subsequently served in Korea, Egypt, England, Aden, Cyprus, Berlin, Hong Kong and Borneo.

In common with six other infantry regiments a 2nd Battalion was raised in 1952, only to be disbanded in 1955. When the new Light Infantry regiment was formed in 1968 the 1st Battalion was serving with the United Nations Force in Cyprus. The current Regimental Secretary, Major Chris Lawton MBE, was the last serving member of DLI in the Light Infantry, up until his retirement in 2004.
