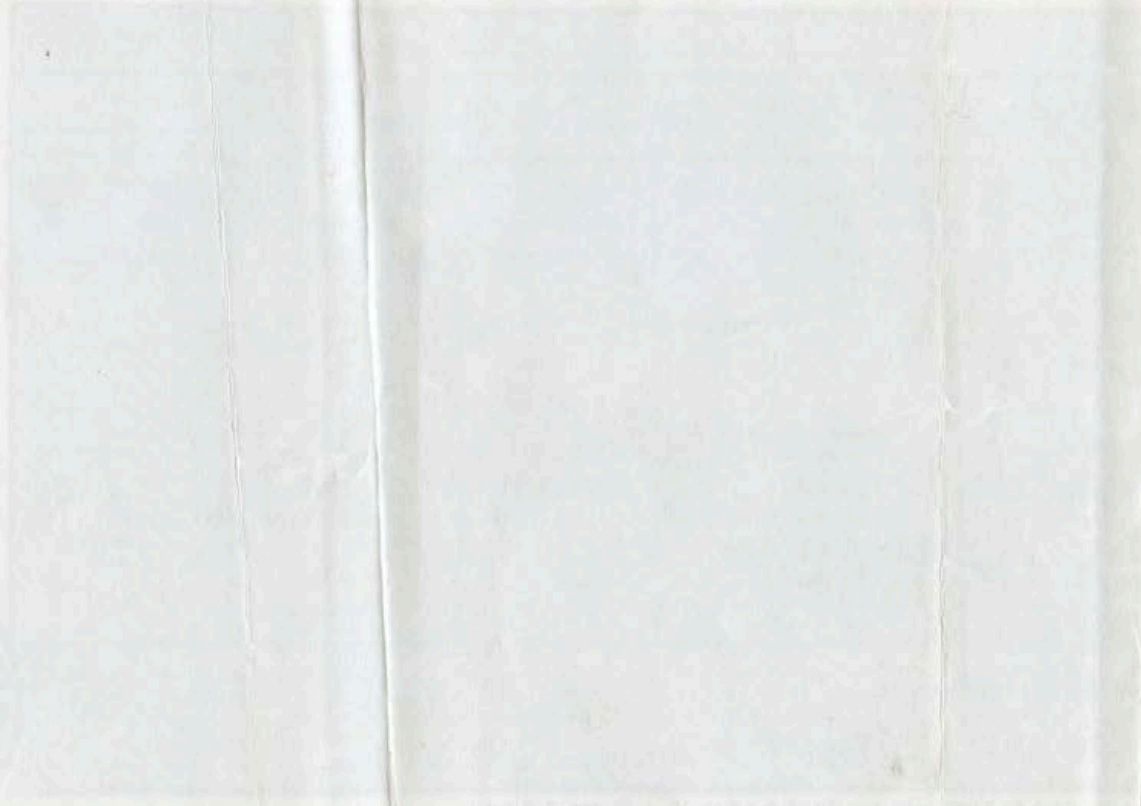

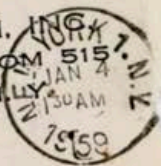

I am directed by the Registrar-General to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the *1st inst* enclosing the sum of _____, and applying for a Certificate of *Birth*. In reply I am to inform you that the fees for a Certificate of Birth, Death, or Marriage, applied for through the Post amount to 5s. 1d., viz.:—2s. 6d. for a Search in the Indexes over a period of 5 years or any part thereof, and 2s. 7d. for a Certificate (see detailed statement overleaf). If, therefore, you will fill in particulars on the enclosed application form and return it to this Office, accompanied by a further remittance of *5s 1d*, the Registrar-General will cause search to be made and, if the desired Entry is found, will forward a Certificate. If, however, the Entry cannot be found, the Certificate fee (2s. 7d.) will be returned to you.

The fees may be paid by means of a ~~POSTAL ORDER~~ or, if from abroad, an **INTERNATIONAL MONEY ORDER** made payable to the REGISTRAR-GENERAL, crossed "Bank of England" and sent, with the application form, in an envelope addressed as above.

It should be noted that it may not be possible for Search to be undertaken unless the full particulars asked for are furnished.

Information respecting the issue of Birth, Death, and Marriage Certificates, applied for through the Post.

(1) Fees.

(a) For a Particular Search in the Indexes for a period not exceeding 5 consecutive years*	s. d.

* The Search fee is 1s. if the Applicant attends at Somerset House and makes the Search personally.

- (b) The payment of a Search Fee does not entitle an Applicant to information as to particulars recorded in an Entry, such as the precise date of Birth, Marriage, or Death, the cause of Death, etc. Such particulars can be furnished only by means of a Certificate.
- (c) In every case a Certificate issued from the General Register Office must be a full and complete copy of the Entry as it appears in the Register.
- (d) If an Applicant having sent to the General Register Office a portion only of the Fees, does not desire to proceed further in the matter, the Registrar-General, upon being so informed, will return the remittance after deducting any Search Fee that may have been incurred.

(2) Indexes.

- (a) The Indexes relate mainly to Births, Deaths, and Marriages in England and Wales and date from the 1st July, 1837, to within about twelve months of the present time. The Registration Act did not come into operation until the 1st July, 1837.
- (b) In any case relating to recent events where the index is in the course of preparation and not available, search usually can be made direct in the unindexed Records, provided that information is furnished as to the precise date and place of the event; the Search Fee payable is 2s. 6d. in respect of each Registration District and any one Quarter.

(3) Cheap Certificates for the purposes of certain Acts of Parliament.

THESE ARE NOT ISSUED FROM THE GENERAL REGISTER OFFICE, SOMERSET HOUSE.

- (a) All applications for such cheap Certificates must be made on the prescribed forms, which can be obtained from the local Superintendent Registrar of Births, Deaths, and Marriages. The form of application, after having been duly filled up, should be forwarded with the required fee and a stamped addressed envelope to the Superintendent Registrar having the custody of the Register in which the Birth, Death, or Marriage is recorded.

- (b) The fees payable for such Certificates are as follows :—

For the purposes of the National Health Insurance or Unemployment Acts	Birth 6d., Death 1s., Marriage 1s.
" " " Elementary Education, Employment in Labour of Child or Young Person, Shops Act and Representation of the People Acts	Birth 6d.
" " " Post Office Savings Bank, Trustee Savings Banks, War or National Savings Certificates and Widows', Orphans' and Old Age Contributory Pensions Act	Birth, Death or Marriage 1s.
" " " Friendly Societies Acts	1s. if only one certificate is required, or, if application is made at the one time for more certificates than one of the same Birth or Death, 6d. for every additional certificate.

In the last-mentioned case, if the Registrar is required by the applicant to fill up the form of Requisition, an additional fee of 3d. is payable. No Search Fee or Stamp Duty is payable.

- (4) **Applications** will be dealt with in the order in which they are received. Generally, if full and correct particulars are furnished, Certificates will be despatched about 2 or 3 days after the receipt of the Fees, subject to the number of prior applications. Where, however, a Search is of a difficult nature, or a number of Certificates is required, a delay of several days may occur. Similarly in the case of an unsuccessful Search, the result cannot be communicated until after the lapse of some few days.

My father's name was Rubin Isaac Hurst (he died in London 1840). My mother's name was Fanny Kossof (she died in London 1911). To explain the change of name: in my profession as a writer I used the nom de plume, Paul Brunton, and eventually continued it as the legal name by Deed, inscribed at Court of Judicature, London. I had no brothers and no sisters.

I was educated at Central Foundation Secondary School, London; in evening classes at St. George's College, London; by correspondence study courses with McKinley-Roosevelt College, Chicago; and by private tutors. I got a doctorate of philosophy.

My first marriage was to Karen Augusta Tottrup in 1922, but we divorced in 1928. A son was born in 1923 named Kenneth Thurston Hurst, who is now manager of the international department of Prentice-Hall Inc., educational textbook publishers in U.S.A. My second marriage was to Evangeline Young in 1952, but we divorced in 1958.

I began my career in the Civil Service, Government Patent Office, London. It was interrupted by military service, 1917/18. I then worked in the Municipal Libraries office of W & G. Foyle, Ltd., book company in London; and then in various positions with various employers, studying journalism and writing during spare time. I then went to India to write a book about that country; I next did the same in Egypt, gave lectures and did further literary work in U.S.A. I continued researches in India for several years and then lived in U.S.A. for several years.

I went to Australia in 1960 and my last place of domicile was Auckland, New Zealand. In 1964 I returned to Europe to seek a place for permanent retirement for the rest of my life as I was then more than 65 years old. With this purpose I visited Greece, England, Portugal, France, Italy and Switzerland—and finally decided to apply for Swiss residence.

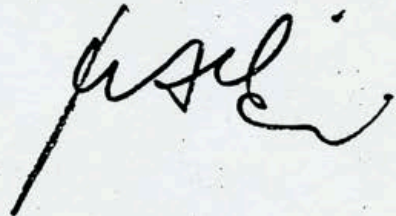
