Evangeline Glass Journal 12 (1956-1958)

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Editor's Note: This journal is extraordinary, and a very special gift to the archives. Please treat the contents with respect. This journal spans the period of Evangeline's second marriage to PB (10/7/57 – 4/14/58), her falling in love with Beaumont Glass (January – March 1958), her divorce from PB and her marriage to Beaumont (June 1958) in that order. At the time she was also taking music lessons and performing. Any and all of these put tremendous stress on the psyche, but reading her journal, we find a person primarily full of love for both her husbands, and full of spiritual aspirations for herself.

Many of the entries contain very practical advice from PB on practicing what he calls the Short Path, for which Evangeline is very well suited. She has decided to share this journal with us out of her recognition that many others will have to go through (somewhat) similar upheavals in their lives and that PB's words will provide both solace and guidance. I had to add "somewhat" because leaving a spiritual teacher's side is seldom without trauma or drama — or very amicable for that matter. Yet we see that PB is nearly continuously in contact with Evangeline, even in the months after their separation and into the years of her marriage with Beaumont.

Beaumont was a remarkable man who was able to recognize his wife's special devotion to PB both as her teacher and as her first husband; throughout the next 50+ years PB would come and go from their family circle as his travels and obligations allowed. It is also true that few who met PB with an open heart did not want to see him again, and often! While Beau never particularly practiced spirituality, he had profound respect for Evangeline's mysticism and for PB to the very last days of his life. At the time of this journal Beau was just starting out as a piano accompanist for voice coaches; in a matter of years he became Lotte Lehmann's primary accompanist and her biographer—and produced or directed any number of operas for the 19 years the family lived in Zurich.

There are many musicians, composers and compositions listed in these pages; also there are frequent references to Buddha or Buddha Gerace. It is clear that this was Evangeline's vocal coach but we have not been able to garner more information about them (or where they got their name from). There is also a reference to a Dr Misra whom we could not identify. As for the extensive book notes, for the most part we have left Evangeline's edits in the body of the text and put the original quote (where available) in a comment.

Anything marked "Guruji," "G," or "Raphael," is either a reference to PB, or is meant to be a direct quote from him. Most of the book notes and quotes are those garnered by Evangeline for her own use, though the philosophical texts are likely to have been PB's suggestion. Evangeline sometimes refers to herself as "Eva," "Noel," or "N" - and sometimes refers to herself in the third person, or is transcribing a message from PB where that occurs. In order to make the entries more easily navigable, we have added titles to each entry. All these titles were created by our team and have not been confirmed by Evangeline or her daughter Melody Talcott. For more information about the people and texts Evangeline quotes or references here, please see the file titled "Wiki Standard Info for Comments." For more information about the formatting that we have implemented please see the file titled "Introductory Readers' Guide." This guide includes two tables detailing the chronology of the journals. We have introduced minimal changes to the text; our changes deal with inconsistencies of spelling, educated guesses at illegible words, and the rare modification of grammar for clarity's sake. Whenever there is any question as to whether what is typed is what Evangeline wrote, please consult the associated scan of the original pages, currently to be found in a PDF of the same name. – Timothy Smith (TJS), 2020

ourselves against this hour with all manner of forts except the impregnable fort of Faith in You! And how blind are we in seeking You anywhere save in our own selves!"

"Man's only glory lies in his gradual ascent from the human in him to the divine; from the perishable to the imperishable; from the unbeautiful⁴ to the beautiful; from delusion to Truth; from Life's dual appearances to Life's inner unity.

We are all on the way. But the way is strewn with aches, furrowed with pitfalls, and shadowed with snarling passions. Yet does the spirit of God hover over it, and the light of God pierce the heavy mist that veils it.

Men differ from men insofar only as they keep, or do not keep, their eyes on the goal; or as they set, or do not set, their hearts on reaching it. Some toddle on the way, amusing themselves with pleasures that soon turn into pain. that you are created by God and are Spiritual), Spirit becomes the Reality and matter – the Shadow. (Noel) In other words, the wisdom of man becomes a tool, just as the unconscious wisdom of the animal, our bodies are used by intellectual and artistic man. They have their worth and place, but are not ultimate. They only serve on their own levels whereas God rules all and is One. Thus is "Fulfillment," not "Destruction," and one grows out of, but still uses knowledge of body and matter.

September 7th 1957

Quogue

In meditation tonight after a few minutes all identity – personal and spiritual – was gone – an annihilation of the ego (individuality), non-being, blackness, no feeling or thoughts, static peace, void.

After 40 minutes passed and I came back to ordinary consciousness, dazed with an abrupt contrast between the void and individuality – the world. I felt – "I have never existed and never will again exist. It was like death, death of the ego. Now I know fully what the ego is.⁴² It was if it were at that point in the interval between incarnations⁴³ when I was neither the previous identity nor the next one. For 40 minutes nothing existed. There was not even a consciousness of "I am" (The Higher Self) to witness this void. "I am" was absorbed, annihilated in it. When I came back to ego consciousness, looking at Kenneth and P.B., it was so strange to become Evangeline again.

Now, I feel through this descent of Grace a detachment, calm and greater freedom from self. "She" is not important – everyone else matters, just as much – all springing from the One Source. What "she" desires is not too important.

At the beginning of the meditation "She" did not feel like meditating. She had no uplifted emotional mood for it, as usual, quite the contrary, but sat down anyway because she knew it was the thing to do. She felt a tremendous vibration from Guruji which quickly overcame the body, stilling it and then – annihilation – like night

descending and all loss of consciousness. Never before had the thoughts been stilled before so quickly and so completely before.⁴⁴

Talk with Guru later, telling him and answering his enquiries about this⁴⁵ state of being (or non-being) his comments:

- 1. You must read Buddha's analysis of 6 [states]⁴⁶ of consciousness in meditation. He mentioned "non-being." Now you can understand more of Buddhism.
 - 2. This was a descent of Grace.
 - 3. An annihilation of the ego.
- 4. Because you were not in an emotional mood (higher ego or lower) before meditation and it was easier to leave ego. Both combined.

Back to Noel -

In all previous meditations and glimpses the higher ego would continue to {have}⁴⁷ spiritual thoughts while dominated by the presence {of}⁴⁸ the Higher Self. That is how I knew I was the "I am" because of the contrast between the thinking ego and the ruling "I am." It was a duality. Tonight there was no duality, not even⁴⁹ a unity, but only an emptiness, when I used to be "I am" especially during sleep, the ego was still, I realized its nature to be life, light, deathless and birthless being, in a positive way. But tonight there was no such realization of the "I am" and instead a sensation of peaceful annihilation. It was quite free from morbidity and even from all feelings and emotions whatsoever.

Since this is something that started from the beginning of the meditation and with such intense force, I must conclude that it is a descent of Grace taking, what is for me, a very uncommon or {unusual}⁵⁰ form.

Now I can fully understand why Maharshi⁵¹ could sit in one spot and say that neither we nor he, nor the entire world exists. This is true – but with the⁵² teaching and guidance of any Guru, I know that this is the "Truth" but what of all those who do not know this truth but are seeking it? They need guidance and help. As Guruji says: "A child can feel (to itself) just as badly upon losing a doll as a mother who loses a child. So therefore the enlightened ones look on people as children who need help and guidance, and therefore become fathers and mothers in the largest sense – Spiritual

When one gains this knowledge it does not necessarily mean that one will not incarnate anymore – One can still incarnate and know that the ego is not the self and live as an actor and spectator of life and teacher to the children of humanity.

She¹⁷⁵ told how she could use the thought of the wide ocean, of the immensity of space, or of limitless light, to draw her mind forward into the supreme act of contemplation.

The soul recognizes that it is only from within God that God is known. Such apprehension of God is realized, not through deliberate and logical approaches of the discursive reason from outside the object of its search; but through the inward and immediate and intentional contact of life with life. The lesser life sheathed (as it were) within the larger and is aware of the encompassing element which is in possession of it, within and without. In so apprehending, the soul is not effortless but the effort is exercised, not in seeking and finding so much as in <u>surrendering</u> itself¹⁷⁶ to being found. The resignation, the acquiescence, the self-abandonment, which is necessary in order to receive the increasing power, is itself an act of high and tense energy. fails to satisfy us, when a friend has disappointed us, when our plans are spoiled, when we are sick and lonely? This is when we look for the consolations of God.¹⁹⁷

But let anyone have all that he can fancy, be carried high upon the flood-tide of prosperity, ambition, and success, and how much time will he or she give to God?¹⁹⁸ – not two moments during the day. Yet the Maker of all things is to bestow His unspeakable riches upon us in return for two moments of our thought or love! Does a man acquire great worldly wealth, or fame, in return for two moments of endeavor?"

"One must outgrow the raw uncivilized creature that he or she was.¹⁹⁹ All tastes must alter (all capacities will increase in an extraordinary manner), and all thoughts of heart and²⁰⁰ mind must become acceptable to²⁰¹ God. But the cultivation of our individuality must not be subverted to the purpose of the mere gain of personal advantage, but because of the heartfelt wish to conform to the glorious will of God."

"We are not taught when children that what we are here for is above all and before all to arrive at a sense of personal connection with God, to identify ourselves with the spiritual while still in the flesh. – We are taught to grow shy, even ashamed, of the spiritual! and to regard the world as a place principally or even solely in which to enjoy ourselves or to²⁰⁹ make 'a successful²¹⁰ career.' I cannot leave my business, my children,²¹² my home, my luxuries, my games, my dresses, my friends. Neither need you but, knowing this initial agony of mind, Christ said it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle (the name of an exceedingly narrow gate into Jerusalem) than for a rich man to enter heaven.

What does it mean to 'set the heart' upon something? We say, 'I have set my heart on going to see my son,' 'I have set my heart on doing so-and-so,' but this does not mean that in order to accomplish it we must wander homeless and lonely until the day of achievement. No, but we set our heart and mind upon eventually accomplishing this wish, we shape all our plans towards it, we give it the first place. This is what God asks us to do; give Him the first place. We need not go to Him in rags – David and Solomon were immensely wealthy, Job²¹³ was a rich man, but we must eventually think more of Him than we do of our dress, than we do of our business, more than we do of lover, friend, or child – 'Thou shalt love Me with all thy heart and mind and soul and strength.'

When we desire He sends the capacity, and day by day sends us the power to reach this love through Jesus Christ.

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"The petty human aims, the smallness of our former standards, the instinct for 'retaliation,' must all be overcome, laid upon one side – a slow task of much humiliation to the creature, revealing²²² it its own smallness and vanity and its own extraordinary ineffectiveness of self-control,²²³ its puny powers over itself: nothing short of an absolute self-conquest is aimed at and demanded by this inward monitor – the Soul.

With what profound veneration for and recognition of the power of God does the regenerated creature think of those alterations in its own nature which, after long

strivings, are eventually given it by God, and of those alterations not yet stabilized because not yet gifts, but only on the way to perhaps becoming gifts, – i.e.²²⁴ still only where the power of the creature itself has been able to raise them: for of these last it may invariably be said that today we may feel serene security and tomorrow fall and fail – and this in the very meanest way!

We²²⁵ see men and women who try to fill an emptiness within²²⁶ themselves – a wanting – by every sort of means except the only one which can ever be a permanent success. Women devote themselves to lovers, husbands, children, dress, society, and dogs. Men to business, ambition, the race track, drink, games, and arts. They descend to old age surrounded by the dust of disillusionment. Lonely and soon forgotten by the hungry pleasure seeking crowd."

What can be more beautiful, more happy,²²⁷ to find the only Being who loves us as much as we love ourselves.

All of us seem to have two personalities. The repentant and unrepentant Magdalene. But true repentance cannot come before love.

At first on awakening the soul would like to cast away material things and is inclined to despise the body. But – it is His will that she should lend assistance to²²⁸ the creature in its weaknesses and uncertainties, <u>not disdaining it</u>, but helping it. It is the soul which maintains contact with the Divine Guide, and then in turn should guide the creature. As the Divine Guide condescends to the soul, never despising her, so must the soul condescend to the creature: acknowledging that nothing is too small or humble for the soul to attend to and lead the creature to do in a beautiful and gentle manner.

The life of conscious connection with God is true living as far as we may know it in the flesh, an enormous increase over the petty normal life of the world or, more rightly, the petty and <u>lacking</u> life of the world. For in this life of God-consciousness is an immense sanity and poise, a balance between soul and body and heart and mind never achieved in the "normal" or the "natural" life. Therefore the God-conscious life is not to be named an abnormal but the complete, full,²²⁹ and only truly normal life: a life in which both soul and creature have found their center, and the whole being in all its parts is brought to evenness, to harmony and peace and a greatly magnified intelligence.

To convey some idea of this condition of consciousness would seem to be impossible, still there are some types of people to whom a little something of the commencement of the larger life of the awakened soul might be conveyed before they themselves experience it. The lovers of nature, of music, of the beautiful and romantic,

and of poetry: in the highest moments reached by such they are aware of an indefinable Something – an expansion, a going out towards, a longing – yearning, subtly composed of both joy and pain, which goes beyond the earth, beyond the music, beyond the poetry, beyond the beautiful²³⁰ into a Nameless Bourne.²³¹ At these moments they live with the soul: This is the commencement of the spirit-life.

When the Nameless Bourne has become to the soul that which It really is – God – and He sends His responses to her, then the soul knows the fullness of the spiritual life.

But she can neither know the Nameless Bourne as God nor receive His responses till the heart and the mind have come to repentance of their ways and have been changed at least in part.

One of our great difficulties is that when, as the merely half-repentant creature, we turn to God and, beginning to ask favors of Him, get no response, then all our warm feelings and longings towards²³² Him fall back, we go into a state of either profounder unbelief or into total apathy. Apathy is a deadly thing. The more God loves us the more He will do His part to keep us from it. All the circumstances of life will be used to this end. We may lose our nearest and dearest. If it is material prosperity²³³ a too complete content²³⁴ without Him, then some or all of that²³⁵ will be removed.

In whatever spot we are most tender - there He will touch us.

If we do not get out of this apathy, we shall miss the whole reason of our life here.

By these living thrusts He brings us to our knees, humbled, humiliated, anguished, in order that, having awakened and purified us, He may lift us into His Divine consolations.

Let²³⁶ the man who would know happiness here study the works of God, and not think he will gain virtue by putting everything he sees here upon one side, saying it is not real or not good. It is very real of its own kind, and good also if he learns how to use it, and very marvelous. Let him study how things are made – God's things, not trivial man-made things – let him observe how all are made with equal care, the humblest and the proudest, "the tiny violet perfect as the oak." Let him learn the manner of the ways of light and the colors of all that he sees, and then stop to consider how, having made all these marvels, God then fashioned his own delicate eyes that he might see and know and enjoy them all. To consider all these things, accepting them

I began to read "<u>Splendor in the Night</u>" by a pilgrim. She too went through this despair where all the world was separated from her and intense suffering was felt. While reading I went through the exact experience with her, so similar to the pre-illumination experience of 1951. In doing so my heart seemed to break in two and I felt once again shattered and so desperately alone.

Then – quite naturally and unexpectedly – a deep feeling of contact with my deepest self came and with it a calm, beyond emotion. Just as my Guru had said – "beyond emotion." I became the self I have for so long wanted to become. The mature deep expansive self – that which I really am and knew I was. 

seemed to speak to me and showed me all manifestation is his expression³⁵⁵ – each individual – He – Raphael said to this – "All are expressions of God. I asked him what is music from the philosophic "point of view?" balanced and total approach. The correct mental attitude is the chief thing. It is all the mind – all the teaching employed and practiced.

You must develop and use the will. Stop conflict about outwardly leaving me for a time. The Maharshi³⁸⁶ said to be in the presence of the Guru is important for beginners, but to³⁸⁷ advance one must go out on one's own and realize the true being of the teacher. He is not the body and he does not identify himself with the body. So thus you must find him as he really is – within the highest part of yourself.
