He spoke many wise things philosophically about how the body and spirit were one and how he had began to think of all pails of his this that way - his thoughts became strong and positive and his heart began to melt in love for his physical structure so-to-speakall of which carried over mentally, - He began to see so much his thought control as may, and the reconditioning depended upon his mental attitude which he has put deeply practise daily.

It is emphasized, therefore, that the following have been chosen only beacuse they are truly representative.

Saint Anthony (born about 251)
Saint Marcarius the Great (born about 300)
Saint Ausustine (born about 354)
Saint Rernard of Clairvaux (born a bout 1100)
Saint Francis of Assissi (born about 1182)
Saint Catherine of Siena (born about 1347)
Saint Ignatius of Ioyalo (bom about 1480)
Saint Therase (born about 1515)
Saint Thomas Aquinas
It may be said that three conditions emerge as the basis of the attainments of these inspired people: aspiration, devotion, meditation. Fired with a Divine aspiration, they determined no lonfer to be slaves of the senses, but to rise to a plane of consciousness where they conld participate directly in the life of the spirit and attain to a knowledge

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of Reality. The procedur through which they all passed, in a variety of ways, has been summarized by Evelyn Underhill in the following words: "(1) The primary break with the sense world. (2) The new birth and development of the spiritual consciousness on high levels. (3) That ever closer and deeper dependence on and appropriation of the fullness of the Divine Life; a conscious participation and active union with the infinite and eternal." Underhill goes on to remark: "These three imperatives, as we shall see later, form an exact description of the psychological. process through which the mystics pass. If then this transcendence is the highest destiny of the race, mysticism becomes the crom of man's ascent toward Reality; the orderly contemplation of the universal plan." These "three imperatives" describe with a good deal of accuracy the orderly process of evolution, or unfolding, characteristic of the experience of most great Nystics. Excentions there are, of course, as in the case of St. Paul, who experienced insight in a blinding flash on the road to Damascus. Generally speaking, there were long years of aspiration, devotion and silent meditation, interspersed with various and growing evidences of the "descent of Grace". In other words, the spiritual growth of the lystics was not a miracle. It was no adventitious thing, but the natural and inevitable result of an orderly process, pursued with an unselfish, concentratel and one-pointed devotion. This is important to rememher for, if the conditions are fulfilled, what has been achieved once can, with the Grace of God, be achieved again.

What then was it that the lystics exnerienced, which so transformed their lives and made them of such outstandine help to the world? It is generally agreed that when it comes to re-rting a mystical experience; when it comes to an end avour to ex ress in words that which there are











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no words to exoress; accounts must vary according to the background, the tradition and the life of the individual. Despite this, there are many points of similarity in the reports of all the Saints. Perhaps the experience has been most beantifully summarized by Plotinus, who exclaims: WWe said then: If the tumult of the flesh were hushed; hushed the sense impressions of earth, sea, sky; hushed also the heavens, yes the very saul be hushed to herself, and by not thinking on self transcend self; hushed all dreams and revelations which come by imagery; if every tongue and every symbol, and all things subject to transiency were wholly hushed: since, if any could hear, all these say: 'We made not ourselves, but He made us, Who abideth forever.'--If then, having uttered this, they too should be hushed, having raised only our (inward) ears to Him who made tham; and He alone sieak, not by then but by Himself, so that we may hear His word, not through any tonque of flesh nor angel's voice nor sound of thunder, nor in any similitude, but His voice whom we love in these His creatures--may hear His very self without any intermediary at all--as now we rached forth and with one flash of thought touched the Eternal "isdom that abides over all--suppose that experience were prolonged, and all other visions of far inferior order were taken away, and this one vision were to ravish the beholder, and absorb him and plunge him in these inward jys, so that eternal iife were like that moment of insight--were not this: 'Enter into the joy of thy Lord.'" St. Augustine, in his "Confessions" sums it up in one very short sentence: "Thus in the flash of one trembline glance my soul arrived at That Which Eternally Is."

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Eastern Mystics have described tho experience as "The Nnion with the One". Sircar, in his revealing book "Hindu Mysticism", observes: "Spirituality is high knowledge and not only fine feeling. In the last stage it dispenses witl: all relativities of ethics, knowledge, and experience. It gives \(u s\) the blessed freedom in the transcendent.

Knowledge is here intuitive, delight supernal, and life free from subconscious, conscious, and superconscious ways. It is not the freedom associated with the silence of our being. This silence is the accomplished fact. It is not the silence of the urges. It is not even the silence of sleep. The former is artificial, and the later is natural. But this freedom is neither artificial nor natural. It is the silence permanently residing in the heart of being." And again: "And the experience of a per fect order in which the parts are interlocked in the harmony of the whole has been the inspiration of the saints. It is an order which is a living poen. Everything is divine. 'The universe is a gigantic crystal, all whose atoms and laminae lie in uninterrupted order and with unbroken unity.' This unity is represented in different ways. Some makee it a center of love, some of life. The life of spirit feels the nerfect unison, freedom, harmony, and perfect peace."

Sheldon Cheney in his beautiful book Men Wo Have Walked With 'God", has this to add: "It is in the Phaedrus, a dialogue of the middle neriod, that Plato paints one of his few pictures of the abode of the immortals--of Heaven or Paradise. 'Of the Heaven which is above the heavens, what earthly poet has ever sung or yet will sing worthily? . . . There abides the ultimate Being, with which truth is concerned; the Essence, formless, intangible, colorless, visible only to Intelligence, the pilot of the soul.' Of the manmon of the individual soul's seeing in that Heaven, he adds:





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The intelligence of each soul capable of receiving the soul's inheritance is enraptured at beholding the Absolute, is fulfilled and rejoices. . . She sees justice and temperance and absolute knowledge, not as these things are seen in the generative world, relatively, but with comprehension of their essential nature, in absolute existence. With that clairvoyant eye, she sees the truth of being, and glories at the sight, and so nasser to the innermost Heaven and is at home. Such is the life of the gods. . . . 11

Whatever words may have been used in an attempt to describe the experience of the supreme realization, it is abundantly evident from the lives of these Saints that the experience was one which transformed their lives, so that they became the obvious possessors of Divine wisdom and supreme peace, capable of holy achievement. Again, in the words of Evelyn Underhill: "Mysticism, then, offers us the history, as old as civilization, of a race of adventurers who have carried to its term the process of a deliberate and active return to the divine fount of things. They have surrendered themselves to the life-movement of the universe, hence have lived with an intenser life than other men can ever know; have transcended the 'sense-world' in order to live on high levels the spiritwal life. Therefore they witness to all that our latent spiritual consciouness, which shows itself in the 'hunger for the Absolute', can be made to mean to us if we develop it; and have in this respect a unique importance for the race. It is the mystics, too, who have perfected that method of intuition, that knowledge by union, the existence of which

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philosphy has been driven to acknowledge. But where the metaphysician obtains at best a sidelong glance at that Being 'unchanging yet el usive', whom he has so often defined but never discovered, the artist a brief and dazzling vision of the Renuty which is Truth, they gaze with confidence into the very eyes of the Beloved."

From the eastern standpoint, Sircar's description differs little from that of Underhill. He says: "The greatest attraction of spiritual life lies in its promise. Spiritual life embraces and yet transcends moral and aesthetic life; it exhibits life in its fullness. Moral enthusiasm and aestheticism are of the fine fabric of our being, but spiritual experience has in itt something which is unique, and which is its own. Holiness and aesthetic joyousness are invaluable possessions that should find place in sniritual life, but to identify such life with them is to miss its signficiance. Sndrijitual life has in it something which is not probed by fine aesthetic feelings or dignified moral virility. Spiritual life presupposes all these, since it is the fullest unfolding of life; and, where it has its finest expressions, there the chords of life sound in finest harmony. It tonches the very core of our being and therefore transcends all else. Its essence lies in numinous experience. It is neither intellectual nor emotional. It includes these qualities, but it transcends them. The discovery of this 'something' is the unique privilege of mysticism."

Saint Teresa, in her Autobiography, has summed up some of the practical advantages of the mystic experience in words which may be left to speak for all the Saints: "Often, infirm and wrought upon with dreadful pains before the ecstacy, the soul emerges from it full of health and admirably disposed for action . . . is if Gord had willed that the body



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itself, already obedient to the soul's desires, should share in the soul's happiness. . . . The soul after such a favour is animated with a degree of courage so great that if at that moment its body should be torn to pieces for the cause of God, it would feel nothin but the liveliest comfort. Thคn it is that promises and heroic resalutions soring up in profusion in us, sofaring desires, horror of the world and the clear perception of our proper nothingness. . . . What empire is comparable to that of a soul who, from this sublime summit to which God has raised her, sees all the things of earth beneath her feet, and is captivated by no one of them? How ashamed she is of her former attachments! How amazed at her blindness! What lively pity she feels for those whom she recognizes still shrouded in the darkness!. . . She groans at having ever been sensitive to points of honor, at the illusion that made her ever see as honor what the world calls by that name. Now she sees in this name nothing more than an immense lie of which the world remains the victim. She discovers, in the new ligh from above, that in genuine honor there is nothing spurious, that to be faithful to this honor is to give our respect to what deserves to be respected really, and to consider as nothing, or as less than nothing whatsoever perishes and is not agreeable to God."

In his moving book, "The Saints that Moved the World", Rene Fulor!!iller has this to say: "The saints believed in Christ in whom the kingdom which was 'not of this world', did become a reality in this world. Christ, whom the saints strove to imitate, undertook His divine mission on earth in the guise of a mun amons men; He suffered and died under the laws of this world, and still, in Him the ethical demands, the love and the heauty of the divine principle attained earthly fulfillment. It was this that encouraged the saints, who segan their lives as average men and















women, to follow Christ; that cenvinced them that they would be able to reach Him if they took care in all their wanderings never to lose sight of His footprints. What raised them to the status of sainthood, was the fact that they succeeded in extricatin themselves from their lowly beginnings and worldly entanglemonts, in mastering their innate weakness to attain the ultimate heights of human existence. It is this endeavor on the part of the saints that constitutes the great message which the lives they lived and the examples they set will continue to have for all times."

\section*{APPLTCATION TO :ODERN LIFE}

Are the lives of these Christian Mystics merely something which we can admire? Are they merely evidences of achievement which was possible in an age which is gone, but which we are doomed to regard with a frustrated hopelessness? Or are they examnles of a life and an experience which can be duplicated in this twentieth century by anyone who is willing to fulfill the conditions and obligations: We listen with ecstacy, and perhaps with some envy, to the music of a master violinist or pianist, and ignore the daily hours of faithful, devoted practice, of ten from childhood, which it has talen to roduce the virtuoso. In a world which is ridden with fear and hate, are there not untol numbers who w uld emerge from their miasma, at no matter what cost, if only someone would point the way? In a world faced with the probability of new wars which would involve the possible exterinination of the numan race, we set up new organizations and new conferences, in the futile hove that machinery alone can produce the much longed for peace. Is it not a truism that peace must begin in the heart of the individul person, hefore it can be multiplied

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into a world expression? Surely, then, the time is ripe to encourage and foster the exploration of the mystic way. Christ adjured us: "Seek ye first the Kingdom of God" and then went on explicitly to advise us: "The Kingdom of heaven is within you". "It is within, not without, that a portal opens upon Cod's presence."

Bede "rost in his book "Saint John of the Cross", includes the following: "The soul in its early seekins after God usually falls into the error of Augustine, 'I found Thee not, O Lord, without, hecause I erred in seeking Thee wi thout that wert within.' For 'the Word, the Son of God, together wi th the Father and the Holy Spirit, is hidden, in essence and presence, in the inmost being of the soul; so that the soul that would find Him must go forth by the detachment of its affection and will from all thines, entering within itself in fullest recollection, so that all things ame as nothing to it. . . . It is a great contentment for the soul to understand that God never fails it, even though it be in mortal \(\sin\), and much less when it is in a state of grace. . . . There desire Him, there adore Him, and go not a out seeking Him outside thyself, for so shalt thou be wearied and distracted. . . . Yet one thing is to be remerbered, thet, although He be within thes, He is hidden. But it is a great thing to know the place where He is hidden in order to seek Him there with certainty.'" Or, in Sircar's words: "The fulness of life dawns suddenly upon recertive souls. It can come to hin alone who has the proper attitude; and thisattitude is nothing but a silent watch of the soul. Constant watchfnlness helps the soul to be receptive to the finest expressi on of life. This watchful silence unties the knots of our psychic being, and makes it responsive to the soul. It also makes it res onsive to the current if life, revening ils divine orientation. "he seeker is reborn. This is the qrest clain of mysticism."


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Let us assume that Christ meant what He said. Vould He have edjured his listeners to seek that Kincdom of God which was within them if it had been somethin impossible for them to attain? The very fact of the injunction to "seek" has implicit within it the assurance that if we do seek, we can most certainly find. Then, one may say, it becomes a question of procedure. We go back to the brimary requisites which we found to be present in the experjence of the Saints; asviration, devotion, meditation, and we can adopt the procedure to which reference already has been made, outlined by Evelyn Inderhill:
1. The primary break with the sense world
2. The new birth and devel opment of the spiritual consciousness on high levels.
3. That ever closer and deeper dependence on an a propriation of the fullness of the Divine Life; a conscious particination and active union with the infinite and eterna \({ }^{\prime \prime}\).

For practical purposes, the many human beings who are conscious of a profound urge at the present time tovard sonething "better", can be divided into two main grouns:
a. Those who consider themselves to be "practicing Christians" because of their affiliation with some organized Church, and to whom the idez of aspiration linked with devotion vould therefore be an acceptable one.
b. Those who consider that Christianity has failed and that it is useless to take any nart in "useless" traditional devotional practices.

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Properly and intelliqently presented, there is no reason why the Nystic ". ay should not eventually anpeal equally to both grouns, but the initial approach in Group b. obviously would have to be modified to meet their present mental and emotional outlook. The key to the whole problem is the third condition, meditation.

It would not be an exaggeration to say that there is no subject about which there are greater misunderstandings and misconceptions than this question of the practice of Neditation. For that reason, it may be worth while to devote a little attention to an examination of what meditation really is. When it is described in Evelyn Inderhill's phrase: The primary break with the sense world", one of the first objectives is outlined without giving any idea as to the m ethod by which such a "break" is to be achievedrefteved. A little analysis of the processes of our every day lives will lead to the discovery that most, if not all, of our waking time is devoted to "paying attention". To what is it that we pay attentinn? Obviously, to the renorts of our five senses. "e hear, see, taste, touch and smell. These daily experiences, brought to the brain through the medium of the senses, make up the warn and the woof of our lives. It is a common experience that if we happen to be intensely concentrated on one single thing, such as the reading of a book, sonene can speak to us and we do not hear. Tn other words, we are not "paying attention" to reports from our sense of hearing. Who has not become so immersed in some especially intriguin occupation that all sense of time is lost, and such things as ringing telephonse are not heard; somet ing burning is not smalled, and so on? We apprehend at any given moment of time that to which we are paying attentio.--and nothinc else.
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This leads to one obvious, but very important, conclusion, namely, that our minds are capable of sel ectively raying attention to the reports of any given sense, or senses, to the exclusion of the others. When the mind is intently engaged on aying attention to one single subject, or thing, we say we are concentrating.

Primarily, then, at the outset, meditrition is nothine more mysterious than the further development of the ability of the mind to pay atention solely to that narticular object, or thought, which is picked for attention and to exclude from attention all other reports of the five senses. So long as the object chosen for exclusive attention is a "sense" object, we are not achieving "The primary break with the sense world". At the outset, however, it is sufficiently good and necessary trainine to develo the ability to pay attention to one single object, or thought. At first, it will seem hopelessly impossible, because our minds customarily receive from minute to minute such a host of impressions that it is accustomed to paying attention in a great many directions at the same time. Gradually to train it to pay attention in one single directed spot is, therefore, not easy. Neither is it easy to learn to play a diano without arduous hours, weeks and months of practice. Surely the end is worth the effort.

Brunton describes the process with authority in his work "The Quest of the Cverself", as follows: "Concentration consists in stopping this ever-changing habitual wandering of the intellect, and in keeping it. steadily directer to a single line of travel, by entering deeply into a special thought. To achieve this it is necessary to ignore the impressions aind physical sensations w ich are thrown into one from environment, to hush the noise of worldly life int. mental silence, to leep out the

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swarm of intruding and extraneous thoughts by practising conscious control of the mind during the half-hour or so of meditation. In short, whilst thoroughly thin ing about the chosen subject, there must be a willed resistance to the impacts of perce tion which come from without and to the uprisings of alien thoughts which come from within. One cannot immediately destroy them or blot them out, but one can set up an unfaltering purpose, an ideal of remaining unmoved by them like a rock over which the waves of the sea dash in vain, unable tc dislodfe it from its firm foundation. During the first half of one's practice one will feel an almost uncontrollable urge to leave it, to get up and be busy with something else. The mind will complain bitterly about being turned away from its wonted tracks, about the tyranny of being turned unnaturally inwards, while itself glad to submit to the far greater tyranny of being externalized throughont the day. The restlessness of the mind is the general discovery of all people who tal:e up the practice of meditation. This discovery is confirmed by every early effort and leads at first to some disheartenment. The first fumblinf efforts leave a sense of failure and fatigue. One understan's then that only a small fraction of one's thoughts is one's own, the rest being but an undisciplined, rebellious mob. If one yields to these negative feelings, one is headed for failure. If, hovever, one accepts the fact that the task undertaken is a serious and difficult one, Gut still perfectly possible and worth while, bravely attempting to carry on with the exercise with cut slackening, there will one day be a reward, when a delightful lull in the tumult of the mind will arise and its ontward-turned bent will be \&ogken through. "Hitherto cne has uresistingly noyed this constant motion of the mind and yielded to it; the moment on berins to still its habitual turmoil there is quite naturally much resistance. This is to be expected.


























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One onght to accent, therefore, the fact of its inevitability and instead of giving uo the practice, because it seens uninspired and barren, persist patiently and hopefully to make the intellect slightly steadier w th encl month that pusses.
"For the mind has been captured by the body and made to serve it, the purpose of meditation is to reverse this position and free the mind from this tyrannous domination so that it may reunite with its rightful master, the Overself. When it eludes one's grasp in meditation and causes outside sensations or forgetfulness of the subject to impose themselves upon one's attention, one should do the brave and difficult thing--ingather it from its wanderings; try to make it introspective and patiently turn its attention back towards its proner focus, hovever tiresome this is and however frequently this must be done. Patience plus indifference to repeated failures is essential to obtain final success."

Any trained psvchiatrist, or psychologist, will be immediately aware of the great value, from the most ordinary standpoint of physical and mental health, of cultivatin this ability to control the activity of the mind and to be canable of concentrsting and directing its attention intensively, at will.

After one has achieved the objective of holding the mind steadily on one single object, or sense revort, the next step is to exclude the reports of the senses entirely, and to concentrate on, or "pay attention" to a thought, or quality, which does not involve the intervention of any of the senses. Then is achieved Underhill's qualification, i.e. "The primary break with the sense world." And there is hpthing mysterious about that, eithor.








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From the standpoint of people who fall into our Group b, i.e. who have no inmediate religious interest, the above practice is as far as one need go, until the time cores, as it inevitably does, when the experience so grinel demands something further. The single object of their meditation can he any selected veaceful object, such as a flower; a peaceful scen they know; or any such thing on wich to focus the efontion, for the purpose of attaining one-pointed attention. For the others, however, so soon as thev have passed through the mental discipline of keeping the mind steadily focussed, it is desirable to introduce the spiritual motive. Thus, the object of their sense-free meditation can be the face of Christ and His qualities. A soiration and devotion will grow apace, as the ilystics have recorded and from that time on, the inner Grace is the best Guide.

For the practice of meditation, from the very heginning, it is best to pick a quiet spot and one which, if possible, can be set aside in the home for that sole nurnose. At the outset, 15 minutes first thing in the morning will suffice. Iater, 15 m 'nutes just before retiring can be added. The time gradually can be increased until there are two half hourly periods daily. By then, the aspirant will only too glady devote all the time he can spare to this beautiful period for the development of his spiritual consciousness. It will become an oasis of beauty and ever more constructive reality in the relative desert of his material life.

Sometimes, it is objected that mysticism, or meditation, is simply an escave from reality; a form of narcosis indulged in by those who are too weak to face the kard "realities" of life. This is simply a criticism of ignorance. Anyone who has had the smallest experience will readily agree that, on the contrary, \(t\) incrases the ability to face



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the hard facts of every day life, for the simple reason that they fall into a proper perspective. The practice provides a better mental balance, an avoidance of the extremes of depression, or joy and, as time goes on, it ensures a degree of serenity much to be prized in this hectic world.

It will be observed that up to this point, only the more ordinary results from the elementary practice of meditation have been discussed, because, first of all, they are within the reach of anyone who is ready to be as assidfus in his practice, as he would be in the practice of any other form of activity which he considered of value in his every day life. But as the aspirant persists and particularly, as the intensity of his devotion mounts, he will commence to experience what Underhill calls "The new birth and development of the spiritual consciousness on high levels". Beyond that, it is not necessary to have any discussion for each one will be able to determine for himself whether the sublime experience is worth his while, or not. The kingdom of heaven lies within use, and it is within us and within us only that it can be found. Cheney has found in the words of Plotinus an eloquent description of the beauty which may be anticipated. He quotes:

What is this rapturous joy that thrills through our being, this exaltation upward, this yearning to escape the body and live in the Divine Spirit? -- This is the reaction that Beauty must ever induce, wonderment and a delicious aching, longing and love and a trembling that is all delight. . . . To attain It is for those who will enter the upward path, who will put off all that they have taken on in their mortal descent. For the initiate here, as for those who approach the celebration of the sacred Mysteries, there is required purification, and the laying aside of the
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garments worn before, and entry in nakedness. Then, having left by the way all that is other than God, each in the self's seclusion will know the Aloneness of Being, the Apart, the Undivided, the Pure, will know That from which all things issue, towards which all incline, the Source of Life and Spirit and Being. . . . The Fatherland is The re whence the soul has come, and There is the Father.
"It is a journey not for the feet, which bring us only from land to land, nor for shin or carriage. Rather, close the mortal eyes, and arouse in yourself that inward vision, which is the birthright of all. . . . Withdraw into yourself and look about. If you do not find yourself beautiful yet, act as does the artist who is creating a beautiful statue. He cut away, he straightens, he makes this outline less heavy, that one he purifies, until a lovely image shines forth. So should you do. Cut away what is gross, straighten out what is crooked, lighten the over-heavy, labour to bring forth one glow of loveliness. Never cease working until there shines out from the centre with in you the Divine splendour, until you know that you have entroned the Good in a stainless shrine. When you know that you have become this perfect work, nothing can keep you from the act of union."

Here then is the supreme opportunity for every human being worthy of the name. It is said that a little leaven leaveneth the whole lump. If those in spiritual authority would lend the weight of their influence and example toward the intelligent practice of inte lligently planned and conducted meditation, the effect on the world situation could well be of









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profound importance, since the development of the spiritual man would proceed side by side with the development of the the better citizen; the better business man; the better father and such people, just because they could not help letting their light shine, could be rallying points for those who are groping their way in darkness and despair. "The scent of a flower goes but with the wind, but the perfume of a holy life goes even against the wind."

It is not without reason that the Christian Mystics, Adepts in the art of meditation and prayer, are referred to as "Saints that Moved the World".

Dear Kenneth:
Thank you for your very understanding letter of August 3, telling me of the death of our beloved P.B. on July 27. In retrospect, I realize it came as no surprise. For the past two weeks I have been disturbed (almost distressed) for a reason I could not understand. During that period, P.B. crossed my mind many many times and Ted seemed much closer than he has been in recent years. So perhaps now they have been fortunate enough to meet again.

I am happy that you could be with him during those last hours. "It was a privilege, given to few, to be one of the little "family" that surrounded him. I am only sorry he never made another trip to California -- the last was the year Ted died. We know we shall all meet again, but it is still sad when the ties that bind us on this physical plane are severed.

I know you knew Nitish (Ned) Laharry. He was an Indian barrister, educated at Oxford, whose home was in Calcutta. He represented Columbia Pictures in India, and went on to become President of R.I. But did you ever hear the story of how he and Ted and P.B. became associated?

In 1958, Laharry published an article in The Rotarian on New Delhi which impressed Ted so that that he wrote a letter to the magazine expressing his pleasure and another to Ned Laharry himself. In replying to Ted's letter, Ned Laharry asked Ted if he had ever come across an Englishman by the name of Paul Brunton and said how very much he would like to meet him. P.B. was sitting in our living room when that letter arrived.

Anyway, I came across the enclosed correspondence which Ted had in his files. I copied it in the event you might enjoy reading it -- throw it away when you have done so.
