TO ALL MY CZECH FRIENDS --It is with deep pleasure that I am able to break the silence of the six way years and address you once again. Up to this date July 30. I have received three telegrams and two short letters from the following: Hoznourek, Marik, Zelenkova, Blaha, Capek, Chladkova, Chladek. On July 24th I sent you my first reply, a telegram addressed to Hoznourek but intended for all of you, as is also the present letter, whether I have heard from you or not. My address for all future letters is: Jasmine Villa, Hyderali Road, Mysore City, South India.


I am grateful for your kind remembrances of me and assure you that you have neverbeen forgotten during all this terrible ordeal of the Nazi attempt to destroy the religion and culture, the freedom and happiness of Europe. I have sent you my thoughts during meditations to uphold and strengthen you to support the sufferings into which you have been thrown. You may recall that I told you this war would not be escaped and that your country would fall an easy victim to the German barbarians. But I am thankful to God that so many of us have lived to see this day of victory over them. To understand the spiritual meaning of this war, it is needful for you to read the chapter upon it in my , latest book, "The Wisdom of the Overself" which was published two years ago. I', em writing today to my publishers in London and ordering a copy to be sent you. in the hope that book packet post has been opened to your country (It is not opened yet from India) It is the end of an old epoch of thought, the opening of a new one. Humanity is being brought back to God by various ways, but this result will not be apparent clearly until further tremendous events have taken place.

I am pleased that you have been able to keep your faith alive during the war and still wish to continue on the spiritual quest.

In answer to your questions: I have been in India all this time but since the past two years had serious tropical sicknesses. Twice I was on my deathbed. But now I am in good health again. Only, I have lost a lot of strength and am not permitted to do even half the work I formerly did. Consequently I have to make my letters shorter and rarer. Unfortunately too I cannot get out of this country owing to difficulties produced by the war. I am told that I must wait at least one more year and perhaps even two years before I can get out of India. I shall wait patiently.

I must also tell you that during all these years of my silence I have kept outwardly away from the Maharishee and had not connection at all with his ashram. But inwardly, of course, I often meet him. Also I have kept away from all other Indian yogis and have followed an independent path of development, sided by divine grace. I am convinced that the West will have to find its



Dear Mr. Cash :

I thank you for your letter dated April 26th and wish to explain to you why we asked for separate permissions from you. The reason is that after our nation was set free we were keen on publishing PB's books as quickly as possible to make people acquinted with his ideas and we tried to find some comapnies interested in publishing them. The Unitaria in Prague trying to help us willingly accepted the Perspective to be published next year through the Cirkevni nakladatelstvi in Prague, who work for them, but only this one book. So we were looking for some other publisher to have other books by PB published as well. Such offer came through the Yoga Club in Liberec whom we asked to publish the Essays. Shortly after the PB's books. It was only after we accepted this offer, subject to your permission, that my daughter Mrs, Bardell who lives in England rang me up informing me about the existence of Mr. Josek /Mr. Hodek living in USA being his friend/.

Mr. Josek has never read a n y of PB's books and asked for the Perspectives which I lent him together with the Secret Path. He is going to read them both in Czech and in English just to have an idea what it is all about because in case he would recommend them, he would have to give a correct infor mation to the editor in chief who decided whether they are interested in this kind of literature or not. Mr. Josek believes the reading of the books will take him one month and only then would he be able to inform us. So thequestion is whether Odeon, a well known publishing Co., where Mr. Josek works, would be wil ling to accept the Notebooks at all and when would they be able to publish them. But Mr. Josek himself is of the opinion that having already negotiated with the Yoga Club /officialy the Centre of Yoga Club/in Liberec and the Ustřední církevní nakla-datelství Praha it would not be fair from us to take the orders away from them. Besides, our personal opinion is that these books should be published by someone who is closely interested in this subject - as for example Mr. Larson is, as we learned from Mr. Kenneth T. 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Rirst of all we pray you to ask Mr. Kenneth T. Hurst who knows me from a correspondence. I sent him a few of the letters which I inherited from the late Lida Zelenková's possession written by PB years ago to his Czech students who have all passed away by now. They were : Mr. Josef Hoznourek, Mr. Blaha, Mrs. and Mr. Arnost Cacek /about the latter PB told me in Montreux that "he is the only one who understood the Short Path" which was given them - to Arnost Čapek, Josef Hoznourek, Lida Zelenková and Bianca Lussi in Austria in 1965 where PB invited them for one week's stay and which appeared in the Notebooks as the Tyrol Essay. We are, so to say, the "younger" generation of these students of PB I mentioned above. Both daughters of mrs. and Mr. Capek, Mrs. Michalová and Ing. Formánková participate in our translation team. One of the old still living generation is Marie Marešová, still fully cooperating with us, who translated the Hidden Teaching Beyond Yoga and the wisdom of the Overself as well as the Spiritual Crisis of Man /not yet published/. She is the oldest of us - 87 - but still very active, with a clear mind and excellent memory. Olga Pálková has spent the whole war in England, where she studied at the Cambridge University until 1945 when she returned to Frague. She and myself worked for PB typing his dictations when he visited us in 1948. We all met with PB personally on several occasions in Prague, in Zurich and in Montreux, Olga Pálková spent a day with him in New York in 1977 when he was staying with his son Kennth with whom she spoke twice on telephone.

All this of course cannot by itself be a guarantee to you that our work is as correct as it should be and if there is anybody who can judge it we shall send you some copies for yourself if you wish.

Excuse me for this lengthy explanation but I believe you are entitled to know details about us. Should there exist some other groups - as you mention in your letter - about whose existence we have never, very unfortunately heard of, for we would have gladly cooperated with them - whose translations should be of better quality than ours, we should only be happy to know that these precious books are in best hands and we would, in such case, let our plans drop, although we have translated practically more than half of the Notebooks already.

Now we are leaving the whole matter to God and to your kind consideration because we all have one and the same goal - to serve the noble purpose to which PB dedicated his whole life.

It has been a pleasure for us to be in contact with you at least in this way as we very much appreciate the tremendous work you all have done with the Notebooks.







I believe you have got my last letter of the December 17 th 1937. It was very disagreable to write and to read but I must send it because you had to know the situation. If you have answered it so the letter must went

astray, for I had none.

To day I am about to write other matters. First I have to inform you that the state of health of Madam Zelenková is again very bad. 



I thank you for the last letter and I was full of joy that you were as content with us in all the directions. With this my letter I hesitated almost 4 weeks. I would not molest you with affairs which are here happening, but now I am compelled to turn to you as to my refuge, as to our Teacher. Perhaps you may look on it all as " to much ado about nothing" considering your spiritual height, but I know also that you are at the same time very human—and that you will understand! And—you are the embedded goodness too! are the embodied goodness too!

So your word shell be deciding.

It is a sad letter but cannot help it otherwise, particularly when I know, that yternal peace nothing can ruffle. I also would not write it in order to avoid a notion perhaps of some slander, but I feel at the same time, that such a notion will be far from you. We, i.e. my wife and I are from the day of your depart most agitated and unhappy—because of certain happenings, which are from day to day sharper and which beginn to theeaten and to frustrate the fruit of your veluable work in Prague, seeing that they treaten already our Society Psyche—if there should not come very soon a stopping of it, because there can come a disharmony, distrust and so on. Dear Sir,

I am very glad to come in touch with you and answering your questions from the letter you sent to Mr Hoznourek I am also very pleased to give you some particulars about our Czech mystical School.

First of all I have to say that I am not a great teacher but only a humble disciple of the Universal Mystical Brotherhood which, as you are aware, has its branches all over the world. I have of course my own experiencies in mystic, wwhich I am practising nearly 40 years as they are laid down in my books.

Our exercises are universal i.e. every pupil has to practise according to the same system and all who regularly will carry them through have the same results. The first signs are generally the stigmata

for the inner Man of every pupil must hang on the Cross.

Then appear other mystical or yoga experiencies. For example every advanced pupil must have the following: snowfall, smoke, sun, wind, fire, firefly. lightning, crystal, moon. These forms coming gradually manifest the Brahman in yoga. / Svetasvatara Upanishad / The pupil hears also the tinkling, the bells, the buzzing of the bee, the snake's

hissing, the waterfall, the thunderbolt, etc.

Then there are other many manifestations of the inner forces and also the awakening of the Kundalini, the stopping of the breath / without any breathing exercises/ and seeing the whole interior in dazzling light. This I had myself and others too. This is the forerunner of samadhi. The samadhi has reached only one pupil - a catholic priest, who disapeard from our country. These things I intimate only to you. Tell of them only to the Masters or yogies but not to the beginners.

The exercises are either the inner concentration according to Patanjali and Bhagavad-Gita or the mute repetitions of the vecals IEOUA and later consonants, which all are send in imagination to all parts of the body, commencing in the feet. All this is described in my "Man's Highest Purpose".

You see, that our school is free organisation for everyone can enter it supposing that he has read the Bhagavad Gita and my aforesaid book and that he is willing to carry throught the prescribed

exercising at least half an hour daily.

Our Czech school has its centre in the Society "Psyche" in Prague, which has been established to that end. A member having n o t reached any results during two years is obliged to leave the Society. Only in that sense you have to take the statement that we have here 2.000 pupils. They are members of the Society "Psyche" but they are not true mystics. They are only Tying to take the Path.

My task is only to supervision of the reached results, to correct errors, to give pieces of advice, to lecturing - and to write books, translating also from Masters of India and medieval Europe. The touch with members abrad is carried on by means of letters.

Many pupils are in Germany, some are in U.S.A., in Hungary

and Switzerland.

Our path is the path of devotion or Bhakti Yoga and what we get occurs only through the grace of God. It is marvellous that the disciples get states, which the Indian Yogis receive onlyafter hard special trainings for instance the said stopping of the breath without the slightest breathcontrol. This come to pass with the most advanced. We live an ordinary life without ascetism as a "Grihasta" or householder. But the great passions, much drinking and first all violent anger are to be avoided.

There are of course many hundreds of mystical experiences which for a beginner are strictly kept secret. When the pupil, not knowing them, obtains some, it is for me the best proof of his advancing.

I hope this will be sufficient to give you some idea of our school, which is not a mystical or yoga school in proper sense.

You write to Mr Hoznourek that you could perhaps put me in touch with

some great teacher of India. Such a thing would be for us all a great event and for me it would be a source of immense joy. It would be sure for

us all a strong spiritual impulse of greatest value.

I am afraid, that my letter is already too long but I had three months ago a peculiar experiance concerning your excellent book" A Search in Secret Egypt" and d ont doubt that it will be of some interest for you.

I ordered it at the same time. But my friend got it sooner and brought it to show it to me. I have read a page from the last chapter where you quot the words of the Egyptian Adept you met on the hills above the Kings Valley. The statement of the burried Egyptian Adepts impressed me very much. This time I dide not read more. In a fortnight after that I got the book myself. But the statement of the Adept gave me no rest and I began to have the singular longing to see such a living Adept in his burial place. Not out of an ordinary curiosity but out of some reverence. For as I read I knew at once that it is true and that such readers who would understand it will be in the times to come of great importance. So three days after the reading I prayed lying in my bed to the Goddes Isis to grant me such a vision. For I have to this Goddes a special trust standing in her particular charge. In few minutes I saw in waking state a little slope, not high, as they are at railways, but this slope was govered with stones, debris and clay. In the next instant I was in a subteranean room. It was about 60 feet long and 30 feet broad and the ceiling was comparatively low. The ceiling of the hall was flat and ornamented, polychromed in vivid colours. I saw this for in the hall there was sufficient light. On the left and right there ran files of short columns. They were ornamented also and polychromed. I see even now the green and bluish palm leave ornaments. I went on and I had the sense that the Goddes is present. About ten paces in front there went as a guide a little light of white colour that floated in the air in one level with my breast. But three paces left and right in front of me there moved two beings of peculiar shape. I knew that they were " servants ". They were of gigantic forms so that they went on knees and with bent heads and backs. They were unshapen but not uncanny and were dressed in fantastic manner. From their elbowes there floated something like long rags. Their dress was dim coloured. The faces of them I did not see. Later I knew that they were guardian spirits/ elementals/ of the Adept's tomb. I went on in great silence which reigned in the hall but at once as on a command I stood still and turned my face to left. I stood in front of the blank wall. At once there turned out of the wall silently a great stone block as on a hidden pivot and laid itself down. It was about 8 foot high and three foot wide. Its thikness was about 2 foot. It laid in front a chamber which was dim lighted. The block rolled then away on right quite silently and I saw an Egyptian wooden sarcophagus standing and leaning on the opposite wall. But alas it was closed! Then the vision disapeared. Three days after that I saw the inside of the tomb, but now with the sarcophagus open. There was inside a body like a mummy. Its face was visible and its colour was yellowish like wax. This colour I immediatly compared with wax, but I could not comprehend the reason why that peculiar body should have such a hue for the comlexion of a dead body and also of a genuine mummy looks otherwise.

When I got your Egyptian book and have read it I understood some particulars of this vision. First I did not know that the old Egyptians

have had a device and constructed such doors of heavy bloks turning as on a pivot. You have written that the right entrance to the Great
Pyramid was closed in that manner. Then the ceiling of the hall was flat
for the Egyptians could not build vaults. And I also did not know, that they covered the entranced bodies of the Adepts with wax.

I decided to translate into Czech and to publish your works: " A Search in Secret India" and " A Search in Secret Egypt " and I wrote

to the firm Rider and Co., London.

it is always xa difficult task for me to write an English
letter, because practically I never learned the language. The source
ofx my **Cittle knowledge of English is the fact that I have translated into Tzech nearly 250 English novels, besides some mystic
and occult works— ixxix during the period od some 20 years. The
remainder seems to come as a x memebrance from a previous life.

And so I am always afraid that I do not express myself quite
clearly. This fact explains partly the delay of my wrightings to you.

With the Maharishee I am of course in touch and this fact is showing itself in a peculiar way which is for me quite new. I my book there are not described the so called mystical stages because the sisciple must not know them before he himself does not exxemize experience them on his path. Therefore I must describe you some stages which have had all the advanced disciples of our school. All these must be seen, heard or felt in full waking stage or in half waking or shortly before falling asleep, before awakening or in concentration. Mostly they are coming during the daily

or in half waking or shortly before falling asleep, before awakening or in concentration. Mostly they are coming during the daily routine.

First is the crucifixion as a basis of the path. The disciple feels the wounds of Christ- the stigmata. Some have also visible red spots on hands or feet. This is the first stage, belonging to the mystical death. It has many other stages, as the descending into hell one sees red smoke or dark red flames, one smells burning sulphur or pitch, one hears the barking of dogs the three headed Cerberus. Then one hears the croaking of ravens or beating of their wings. Wide Siegfried in the Song of Niebelungs!

The full description of all the signs is for you superfluxous, but I add only that most of them are to be found in the old mysteries, Egyptian and others and also in the old Crecian and Roman myths. In short this path is in a sense a key toxthe mysteries.

Very interesting are the stages concerning the mystical rebirth. The disciple has numerous feelings like a pregnant woman, from toothache, nauseous feeling till to actual vomiting, the actual bleeding from the nose, the actual feeling of kicking of the foetus in the abdominal parts. One hears also the cries of a little child and so on.

My dear Mr. Brunton.

I have your letter of March 30 th and also your new article for Psyche. I thank you for both! The article is again a true help for our Society and especially your letter is for me a new revelation. I try now daily to search in my subltle Heart to find the secret Atom and hope that by the grace of M. I shall final succeed.

came to light after your departure, have other causes and I shall try to lay them before you to your judgement.

What I write is the purest truth, not one word is false. I have ascertined allk with greatest care wid I have also quite a number of witnesses, who, if you wish are prepared to corroborate my words.



During a f r i e n d l y meetingMr Hoznourek said to me into my face that he does not t r u s t me . Even this bitter pill I swallowed and tried again to make peace. But again in vain, because

there appeared new things .

Your letters to them worked only 3-4 days- no more. They came / i. e. Mr Capek and Blaha/ and promised me fully satisfaction as I have written to you. I said it also in the Society to the members. I waited three weeks- but they did nothing. I wanted only that whe one of them should proclaim in the meeting of our Society that there was a misunderstanding about my and mistake and that all is in order. - When I asked Mr Hoznourek about that, he answered, that is was meant only privately! This is a sufficient proof! They would not hurt their reputation in the Society. They would not recall what they said secretly about me and chiefly about themselves.

This letter contains the most shameful statements about me saying, among others: "There is one who was weighed and found not to be able, but there are others here in Prague who can give you the new doctrine - etc." Such letters have been sent also to other members in the country. All the contacts with my former friends I interrupted and also with the members who are on their side. This last I did because I found that these unloyal members brought my own words ospoken publicly in the meetings to my friends but quite distorted, and also to prevent their contact with the loyal members. Had I not do it then there was the danger that the whole Society of 800 members / not to count 1000 other people who are not direct members of the Society/would break to peices. who are not direct members of the Society/ would break to peices, for the Society stands and falls with me. They take me as their teacher, although I am myself a little pupil. I know that is is my desting and so I will to my last breath serve to our cause.

The whole affaire could not be kept secret on the preconcts of our Society. The whole occult Prague watched us and the things went round and round- to aur greatest damage. The people knew that you have come to us from India and now they do not see the inner dealings

and through alander they received a false light about all this. I have even letters from people who are not members of the Society Tsyche and they express their sympathy to me giving me full trust.

There are many other items but I cannost modest you any more.

Onch Miss Havranek asked me to lend her you dictations about Juana which I did. I fear onch that at Blaha's will come sooner or later to some untrusassertions. I have sent Miss Havranek to Blaha's to ascertain in what state of health is Mrs TZelenková, who lodges at Blaha's. By this occasion Mrs. Blaha said to the Miss that she has also the "Voice". " Voice".

What I need now is the greatest spirotual support for the whole in Prague as in the country looks now to me to give them a kunk Society help in their voga work. I am standing now quite alone only with my wife! So I ptay to God to Mahrishee and to you - for help! I should like to do my duty, but the circumstances are now so entagled that I do not know where to begink. I trust to Maharishee and to you having elsenobody to support me and my faith tells me that I shall not call for he lp in vain!

I am sure that already from the first beguinning after your arrival to Prague H. and Co. tried to make me by all means impossible or at least dufficult to come in contact with you- I mean to visit you at your hotel. Whenever I would call to see you they said you are very occupied, once with corrections, then with writing of letters and so on. The gentlemen weeks in your presence the whole days. This and the illness of my wife and also my own feeling of a certain antagonism of them against me were the causes that at the end I refrained from all further attempts. further attempts.

The first result has been: they said I had no right interest.

The second: they imagine and say so/ also tome/ that they were more in personal contact with you and that they have because of that received a higher knowledge. This is now their trump when you have destroyed their false legends of initiation— of which they said first they have got from you but not me! have got from you- but not me!

So their pride works fine on. And the y use this statement to

lure the members into their circle. They use it to get the greater confidence of the pupils. This they do quite openly now.

Further when they heard that you gave them the first illumination they imagine that every idea which they conceive, must be absolutely correct!

In that way came out many nonsenses and false opinions, which xx Mr. H. and Co. proclaim as the right teaching. They do not know that

the very fine powers which you have imparted with us bear fruits after a long time, xxxxxx perhaps after years and not instantly and that till to that time the pupil can be a victime of great mistakes. The last I have got by intuition and I think that it is right!

From this source sprang further things. The most important

cause is the following:

I have already during you staying at Prague perceived that some people/ who were in contact with you/ mostly women/ look on you as on an incarnated god. You know well that people have always a tendency to exaggerate all what the y seek or hear. This the I let pass. - But when you left us I heard from H. and Co. that are an Adept at the same level as Maharishi, that you have the same powers and so on.

This matter being very delicat I avoided to touch till now, for who am I to judge the spiritual achievements of one who is as far above us all as heaven from earth. But I am a man who thinks always or tries to think logical and so I took in consideration some of your own words in your books, but mainly what I heard from you/ and others too/ and so I strongly refused this notions and said to Mr H. and Co:

No! Mr . Brunton is a great Messenger of gods and oriental Adopts, he is a great Initiate, unique in the West, who has perhaps only three steps to the state of Maharishi and he has the granest grandest and most important missin to fulfil in the West .- And I know that it is true!

But when H. and others heard this it was the beginning of war against me. They said I have the Master not known, I do not understand your teaching, I am a mystic who failed, a benighted man etc.
But I have your own words! For inst. you said at one occasion

in the liftx to me: "Your Guru is Maharishi and mine too!"Or: I said once to you: "When I think intently on the Adept Ra-Mak - Hotep I tremble inwardly". And you answered: "I too!" I could write some 8- 10

exappoles - but this will do.

At the same time I know well that one must have the most possible reverence to the Teacher and Guru, but one must not do it so, a fellow pupil will be by that degraded and hurt in the most foolosh

The notions of H. and Co led to other things. All what you did was for them a sacred and symbolical act. I have written already that at one occasion at Blahas before we concentrated you tried to give to



(puppet / a mascot of a little stuffed Moor/laying at your side on the sopha, a yogic posture. We all amiled at this joke of yours and you smiled also. Who could imagine then that this little incid nt would

produce the serious discord between H. and Co. and me? But it came.
I have written a report of your vistt in Prague in Psyche. I mentioned also this incident to show your sense for humour and to show the people that you are not as the theosophical Mahatmas who stare down

from their portrects at the spectators like owls.

When that issue of Psyche has been published we met all in a cafe. And I asked Mr Blaha how he likes my article about your visit. He said it was good but ther is a fault in it. After my question he said:
The puppet at the sopha concentrated really. Mr. Brunton said it so! Dr Kratochvil sat at my side and is witness of the wholeconversation. I was astonished. Mr Blaha said further that the puppet is your pupil and that it could be in the next incornation a man! We were with the doctor so confused at these bold statements that we did not know what to say. Then came a hot exchange of notions between Blaha and the doctor. At the end proclaimed Blaha calmly: "We three i.e. Blaha, Hoznourek and eng. Capek are initiated into Juana and when you will understand Juana, you will comprehend it!" I thought that the others two will not accept this nonsense, but next week at the meeting in Psyche I heard from Capek the same and also H, did not denied it.

The worst is that I ascertained the base motives, the reason why of this! What follows is a serious accusation, nevertheless it is true. The three gentlemen with eng. Marik would by all means good or bad hunt me out off the Society so that they themselves got a free hand in it.

For this purpose:

We live from the works I have written or translated. Our little revue has only 1200-1300 copies monthly. That is very little after 15 years work! No publishers pay me 1/3 of the net price of my books which we sell. Three years ago my wife bought a little farm in the country but it is so small that we could not live from it. You can imagine that our nation being so small our profit is very limited but people think, that we must have a great income. We can live so only because my wife is a great worker truly a toiler, for she does all quite allone and only by the expedition of revue Psyche she takes a hand for two days. of revue Psyche she takes a hand for two days.

The castle Košátky, deep in debts willbe sold this year in April. They have there for years a forced administration. So they thought they could publish books and live from that business. The rest is clear. They even did not take in consideration my age / this year 71/ nor the brotherly connections and would destroy our livelihood. For that they spread rumours my books are valuless. They have secret agents who workedfor them also in the So ciety. All the work of H. and Co was secret so that I never could prevent them any doings good or bad, as you have believed. These rumours came alreed to the ears of my publisher Zmatlik, who printed of my 100 works 80 c/o. He said to miss Vagner, our cashieress, a trusty person, that my works are only in 60 c/o good. For that purpose their agents spread the rumours that my books are false. At my last meting with H. and Co they said that I cling to the o'd methods of symbilsm using your "Secret Path" page 176. Which is not true, for I never taugt in symbols as you know, but contrary I tried plain them to the reader.
