Kenneth Hurst Letters 1966-1971

Editor's Note: The Kenneth Hurst Letters consist of correspondence between PB and his son Kenneth, covering over 40 years of their lives. There are some references to PB's first wife Karen Tottrup, her second husband Les, and PB's third wife Evangeline Young (now Glass) – who was also referred to as Noel, or Eva. PB and Karen divorced when Kenneth was still young, and Kenneth lived with her exclusively, as was the common practice for divorced families at that time. Then, due to the travel restrictions of WWII, Kenneth's contact with PB was further delayed until the late 1940s – as such, letter writing was his primary form of contact with PB for many years. Kenneth was a difficult child and had a sometimes-challenging path to adulthood. He was a very successful executive for Prentice Hall publishers and did many small tasks on PB's behalf as the latter roamed the globe. His devotion to PB was absolute, even though his own spiritual interests were less strong than those of his father. Most of the letters in this file were handwritten from between 1966 to 1971.

PB had a tendency to make edits, write notes regarding his replies, or insert address information and meeting times on the letters themselves after receipt. We have noted PB's insertions and marginalia, but have not noted edits made by the original author, assuming that they were corrections made at the same time as the rest of the letter. To preserve both readability and the voice of the author, we have corrected spelling errors but have generally left grammar as is. Anything in this file which is handwritten is inside [square brackets.]

Less interesting letters have been summarized instead of fully transcribed. Please refer to the scanned PDFs for the full content, or to view all stationary headers, postmarks, unidentified markings, marginalia, etc. Proper names and dates have been written exactly as found in the original for each letter in this file; where we discovered multiple versions of a person's name, we have noted the full name either in the body of the text in {curly brackets} or in a footnote.

In many letters, there are words that are illegible or missing; in such cases we have included either our best guess or the word "illegible" inside {curly brackets}. In rare circumstances, we have added a word or phrase to a letter for readability, which are also noted with {curly brackets}; a footnote was added where we deemed it helpful. — Timothy Smith (TJS), 2020

1 - 4 Letter from Paul Brunton to Kenneth Hurst Zurich, Switzerland February 28, 1966

[c/o American Express Co. Postbox 671, Athens Greece

Dear Kenneth,

I am writing under difficulties so excuse paper. I came to the airport an hour before {exit} time and went to the dining room for lunch. The plane was to leave at 2 pm, so just before that time, as no call had been made for passengers to assemble, I went out to investigate. I discovered the plane was about to leave and the gangway

was up. SwissAir explained that contrary to British & American custom, passengers in the dining room are NOT called!!

So I have to take the Olympic line plane tomorrow; have parked my cabin things in a locker at the RR station in town and write this in the waiting room.

Now enclosed are two forms concerning your investment I handed the money to Bank¹ LEV, Bahnhofstrasse 32, Zurich. They strongly urged that, in your case, this (comparatively small)² amount should not be put in banks, but in Phillips, of Holland, whose share prices are already 500% above issued price. The Bank says with T.V. coming Phillips are likely to make a further spurt upward. So I agreed. They said the balance in September can then be put in banks. A little gamble (perhaps),³ but these shares still give about {54}% (dividend)⁴ and may rise in capital value. Under the complications of Swiss legal procedure, they insisted that as you live abroad, a Power of Attorney should⁵ be given to someone there in Switz., or someone who is often there, like PB. So PB agreed. Please sign pink sheet at bottom, insert my name under "Full Power of Attorney", put your own name again at top, & date at bottom. Then sign the white card at bottom, & fill in date at left. You will have 40 shares in Phillips.

Return both sheets-papers to me (not to the Bank, to protect you) and I will send them to the bank. You will hear nothing farther but the papers & receipts can be collected when I am here again in July, or by yourself in September, or you can have them mailed on request to any address. The 1st procedure is the one I recommend.

I saw Erna. She was in a great quandary about her art career. She has decided to go to New York & turn the 20/30 busts there into cash. If you can possible do so, please introduce her to Charles Reti,⁶ the art gallery proprietor, perhaps he would help her dispose of some now and later. I think she is finally coming around to our view.

It was very good that we were able to meet in USA several times, & also that the Portuguese holiday may materialise. The notes on Portugal you gave promise a fair time, at {illegible}, just beyond {illegible}, there is a British colony, who have opened the first English pub in Portugal. So your beer is assured!

Your letters Feb 27, March 6 & 12, dear Kenneth . . .

Thank you for offering to make the Portuguese bookings, as it is actually easier from NYC to get information than here. So:-Yes Sept 28 thru Oct 8 will be quite convenient (b) Whether to stay in Lisbon and commute to Estoril? Yes, stay in [LISBON] so that I can collect as much general¹¹ information as I may need. But I want to visit other places in the South and nearby, so we may make a couple (at the most) of one-night visits from our Lisbon¹² base. Both Estoril and Cascais, which is a little farther, can be reached in an hour or so by train, but <u>Algarve</u> in the South will be the one –night trip, also <u>Sesimbra</u>, 20 miles south. <u>I enclose advts in case useful but better</u>, There¹³ is probably a Portuguese Govt Tourist Bureau in NYC, who can more fully advise. I leave you to make choice after getting info. We shall probably have to have a Breakfast only arrangement so as to feel free to move around, I have addresses of Vegetarian Pensions but my experience is that they lack the comforts and arrangements we are used to: so we could visit them for meals only. There are also a couple of vegetarian restaurants, in Lisbon. (c(Txxx¹⁴)

- (2) I mailed the Philips documents to Bank Leu & Co, Bahnhofstrasse 32, Zurich who will hold the shares for you and receive dividends
- (3) We shall have plenty of time for you to visit your Portug. publishers—as many as you wish, for they will serve a double purpose of providing info too!

- (4) Yes I wanted the magazine excerpts on Father John. Thanks for typing them, but carbon not necessary on Book Notes.
- (5) My health has steadily improved, the symptoms have gone, but on Saturday I go into hospital again for the final tests. The artery surgeon and the liver specialist have found my case somewhat puzzling but this week's¹⁵ tests and Xrays will finally determine the diagnosis. I have already arranged for my stay there, veg diet, my own Chinatea etc!
- (6) Please give my kindest remembrances to Edmund. All went well in ch¹6 Zurich, my stay at Baur au Lac was very comfortable. Erna came by afternoon train and left by the night one I believe she found her visit helpful and happy: she may be on her way to NYC now
- (7) The London address labels are excellent. Perhaps you can have some done c/o American Express, which I could use for various cities if street and town omitted. Thanks. I like the new P-H letterhead—very impressive (8) Do you think you will want and have time to see Bernard? If so, do you want his address I have only a postbox one. - (1) Your letter of March 24, my dear P.B., was¹⁸ very welcome. Most important is the good news of your health improving (no doubt due to your own measures). I am very relieved to hear this, and will pass the news to Edmund when I meet him next week for dinner . . . together with your kindest remembrances. Please let me know results of final tests. I am glad you have organized the hospital so well!
- (2) I am mailing you separately via airmail the box mail tomorrow. There is nothing urgent there. Plus some clippings of possible interest.
- (3) Sidenote: Riley is fascinated by my typing and has climbed onto the desk for a closer view. He shows great interest in the keys flying up and down. Sometimes I think he is training to be a human in his next life! Oops, a key just accidently hit him on the nose, his curiosity drew him too close. So now he has flown off in high dudgeon.

- (4) I have written Portuguese Travel Bureau in NYC twice during past month, but no reply! So on April 8 we have a holiday for Good Friday and I will go over in person and collect all data. A colleague at work has vacationed in Portugal. He recommends Cascais, and especially the Algave section as extremely delightful. Says many British and Germans live in Algave. But urges early reservations as hotels jammed in Sept/Oct. So I will make reservations after visiting Travel Bureau. He says Algave has sunny (but not humid) Mediterranean climate. He recommends Fenix Hotel in Lisbon as reasonable and quiet and small. It is near main plaza. I suppose I had better make the overnight visits to Algarvearea at end of stay (to avoid double Lisbon hotel charge)!
- (5) Thank you for mailing Philips papers to Zurich, and for clip on colour TV. The stock is quoted in NYC papers and hovers around \$33.
- (6) The magazines I mailed to California to Mr.¹⁹ were returned "Not at this address". So I will hold them in case he writes and gives you a new address. Then I'll be glad to send them to him again.
- (7) I'm happy you like the London labels. Your suggestion of blank AmerExpress ones is excellent, and I will order them.
- (8) Yes, I will write Bernard that I'm going to Brazil, and ask if I can visit them. I have his postbox address only. Diana wrote she and Jacquesare coming to NYC next month and will see me. I'll keep you informed.
- (9) Have been unsuccessful in finding substitute so have to see Dr. S. on my April 8 day in NYC for the necessary for my trip. But I will be on guard and refuse to discuss Peter Brown—politely. My appointment is at 2pm.
- (10) I had bad spell after you left—every thing went wrong and I was subject to depression and worry fits, and very irritable and out of sorts. But after good meditation last week it cleared up. Things are still going wrong—in and out of office—but I don't feel too worried, and am my usually more-or-less optimistic self. I'm trying to learn the lessons, as there must be a reason. Humility (the need for) seems to be a main one; sometimes my²⁰ ego becomes inflated with exuberance. I must learn to stand aside from it—in success and failure. Our chairman has cancelled all our plans for {illegible}²¹

Letter from Paul Brunton to Kenneth Hurst Athens, Greece May 8, 1966

[Your letters April 24 & May 3rd; ---dear Kenneth – and cable April 28.

- (1) I am very pleased that you have secured a cabin on "Raffaelo" and delighted to confirm the arrangement so do **x** go ahead to finalize. Admittedly postponement of maiden voyages is suspicious, but the same thing is happening to top class British new liners now. These modern ships are so complicated, that maiden voyage dates are really tentative, anyway.
- (2) I also think it would be senseless for you to go to Spain if another PH man is going; and I will have one, or at most, 2 nights in Madrid only, and then leave come direct by air, to save time. to-xxxx So I am in full accord with your new schedule Beirut Athens Cannes Raffaelo.
- (3) Now as regards meeting on July 21st. I may be desirable to use Nice, as our base; for various reasons. It is quite near to Cannes; had a quaint little vegetarian restaurant in the old town which I visited with Arthur. The diet problem has been a troublesome one at times for me. However I will consider the matter choosing between Nice & Cannes and after deciding secure necessary hotel information and reserve two rooms for us; unless you inform me there is any special reason to choose Cannes.
- (4) As regards my leaving Greece, I sail on the 13th May so will not get mail here after 12th. Then my next collection will be in Zurich (c/o American Express, # 20, BAHNHOFSTRASSE) about May 20. Use the Zurich address until we meet as they will forward. The 15th & 16th nights I spend in Venice, should you need to cable, at Hotel London, on Riva degli Schiavoni, (street)

This acknowledges your letters April 30, May 7 & 10, dear Kenneth...

and confirms my cable informing you that I will extend the Portuguese trip to October 15. This should give us a real holiday and yet we should be able to put some activity in, you perhaps in business, I in writing and investigating living conditions there, both in meditation, I hope.

I may have to remain here until early July, having postponed the Yugoslavia trip to August. But I had earlier written the publisher Astrolabio in Rome that if he were really interested in any of the books I would come to Rome on leaving here for discussion. Your firm's bad experience with the previous publisher of a solitary Italian version has been questionable regarding finance. I wrote him on the strength of Erna's report glowing with admiration for Dr Ubaldini, the proprietor or manager, I don't know which. Her info to you that this is new ownership needs confirmation, and in any case this new owner would need scrutiny. I realise now that her lack of knowledge in business matters should have caused me to be more cautious in writing him. Please ascertain whatever further info you can get, since I won't go to Rome if it is too dubious, and since it affects my leaving date here. Thanks.

No—Hutchinsons have no intention of issuing further titles beyond SE & SI in paperback: it was an error that you noted in the books. I have now secured a copy of each. The remaindering of Arrow Sec Path won't encourage them to do more!

The September 28 flight will be started from Zurich, as I should be in Switzerland during Sept

QUERIES: (1) Should I not include a zipcode in the PH address in book? If so, what is it? (2) American Express have no office in Lisbon. You and I will certainly need to receive mail over such a long 3 week period. What address can we use? If you have nothing better, I suggest Wagons-Lit Cooks, who I remember are there. But we'll have to buy tickets or travel-checks to get their service.

page 3: Another point for your consideration, which I rejected at first because of the nuisance of having to rearrange schedules, is that the travel time to and from Algarve being deducted, we would have only about 1 & 1/3 day there, which hardly seems enough for the beauty spot of Portugal, or enough to get acquainted with its possibilities. If therefore an extra day could be allotted to Algarve, it could be taken away from: - either Lisbon or Sesimbra, (thus, dropping the latter, which could still be taken on a partday trip from Lisbon) whichever³⁵ you prefer or whichever is easier to arrange.

Your May 24 letter was gladly received, dear P.B. -

and enclosed is boxmail from Friday night. I was very happy to receive your cable and confirmation extending Portugal trip to October 15. Some confirmations of hotels are coming in, and it is a good job I wrote several alternates as some hotels are fully booked. I hope to have them all confirmed before I leave at the end of next week.

But I have been trying to analyze the "why" objectively. It's the same pattern repeated with many of the opposite sex. Lois, Nancy, etc. After a while my ego enters the relationship and becomes possessive and supersensitive to supposed slight. I realize I'm really more interested in what they think of me, than what I think of them! And I become resentful and want to hurt them. I know it sounds silly, but it's true. I want them as objects, not independent human beings, and I want them to belong to me entirely. Then I become resentful when this impossibility fails to materialize. I seem incapable of having a normal love relationship. In the current case, there's no question of my being "jilted" as in the others, but still the same reaction rises. I've tried to rise above it, to understand it. And to ask why this reoccurs so often in my life. It's obviously a problem in me if I get the "hurt" feelings without even being jilted as an excuse! I must have a terribly possessive ego. On the good side, it does shake me up and out of the complacent routine, and makes me examine and question myself, and pray for guidance and help. And teaches me humility when I see what a raging ego I have. This time I don't want to just "get over the hurt" and go back to normal, I really want to try to learn the lessons once and for all. 

Dear Stanley,

I'm writing you on a personal matter.

A relative of mine has a small balance in his personal account in the National Bank of Australia, amounting to about A\$330. Because he lived in New Zealand for a few years until recently, the New Zealand government will not allow him to transfer this balance out of Australia (except to New Zealand) because of their currency control regulations. However, they would allow him to spend the money in Australia without question; unfortunately he's now in Europe and has no intention of going back to Australia or New Zealand.

The National Bank of Australia say they would cash a check for within Australia, but could not transfer the balance outside Australia without permission of New Zealand.

It's an unfortunate piece of bureaucratic red tape! As you're about the only Australian I know who maintains a U.S. dollar bank account, I wonder if I could ask you a personal favor to help solve this problem. If my relative made out a check to you personally (or any other designation you prefer) for the full amount of his balance, would you accept this check and deposit it in your own Australian bank account. This would then empty my relative's account.

Then, once the check has cleared and you have the funds, would you send me a U.S. dollar check drawn on your New York bank account for the equivalent of the amount you received from the National Bank of Australia. I would then send my relative my own personal dollar check for the similar amount.

I hope this is not an imposition on you, Stanley, but it is the only solution I've come up with to help my relative solve his problem. I hope you understand and that you would not mind helping me and my relative in this way. But, if you prefer not to, of course I will understand.

I will look forward to hearing from you at your convenience.

It is also an attempt to free myself inwardly from the Carol obsession. Although weaker than previously, the infatuation has been dragging on these past six months, and we are both probably tired of it. The good has really gone from our relationship; and the opportunity to advise her no longer seems present. I realize now that the trouble is not Carol (nor Nancy nor Lois) but myself. Such situations serve to bring to the surface the latent emotional weaknesses in oneself and provide the ego with a field day in battening onto them. The object, once secured, becomes unimportant except as a sounding board for our ego. I've been reading Fromm, and according to him I reflect sadistic tendencies in desiring to possess and to conquer and to own the other person. It certainly is not objective love. And this affair has fed upon my vanity and ego-centricity. However, I do feel Carol has made some progress with her psychological problems. So I hope to ease out the affair without creating undue karma.

In examining Dan's papers I'm somewhat reassured to learn he underwent a similar experience with Sylvia Price. I feel tremendous empathy for him! At least, it's good to learn that one's problems are not unique.

Also, with Carol, I came to realize the truth of what you once told me; that in intimacy the vibrations of the partner could be transferred to one. Although we have not been intimate since last August I came to feel many of the psychological problems she was suffering! It has been akin to a long illness, and has distorted my life in many ways, but now I am hoping to be permitted to be inwardly and outwardly free.

Enough of that!

My trip to Brazil was successful. I continue to like the country and its people. I spent a full day with Ida and Bernard at their country retreat. They are both very content and do not wish to leave Brazil (altho Ida says she might go to California if Bernard should die.) Bernard was very sorry to learn of Dan's death. They are quite comfortable there, and make a living from their poultry and gardening activities. Bernard told me Jack had invited him to go to Hongkong to set up a store there; so B. wrote and asked \$5000 plus expenses, but heard no more! Clara Waegner wrote B. she did not wish to leave USA because of her son being here. B still thinks it would have been a good idea for her.

I have gone through and sorted and read Dan's papers which Mike sent me. I enclose a listing of them, and await your instructions. It seems sad to read them all now, and realize despite all the activity there is nothing to show for it. Poor Dan.

I have brought my will up to date, and you are major legatee. So if anything should happen to me, please contact First National City Bank, Trust Department, 399 Park Avenue, New York, NY 10022 as they are my executor. How about your own will? This is to acknowledge your letter of July 2, [and the papers 2 weeks earlier]¹⁵³ dear Kenneth, again . . . and to enlarge on my cablegram of 10 days ago.

Your suggestion that we meet for a week in late September is excellent and I can conveniently do so. BUT it would be well for you to send me an approximately exact date of your arrival in Zurich, as my own dates are still imprecise and might be clearer when I know your own.

My situation is that I recently came to Portugal and have registered the return flight to Zurich for 1st September. On the 4th I have to have a scalp cancer (skin) removed (it's not malignant) and attend the surgeon thereafter for removal stiches and after-healing observation. -This may extend for 2 or 3 weeks. I had originally thought we might go to the Lugano 8 Ascona-Locarno district for your vacation, where Alps and sun combine with tranquility. Anyway Lugano is only about 4 hours train ride from Zurich so it may yet be possible that we could do this and I could go in ZH for the day to attend the surgeon.

It is probably better to go straight off to Lugano-Locarno the day you arrive,

I am very happy we can spend a week together, and the Lugano area sounds ideal. I can leave here the evening of September 15 and arrive by direct flight to Zurich on Saturday the 16th. However, I don't know if this would suit you as you mention moving on the 15th? If it would be more convenient for you I could come a week later and arrive on September 23. I have to be in London by September 30. So could you please let me know whether the 16th or 23rd would be preferable for you so I can make my bookings? Perhaps a brief cable would save time as there are only a few weeks left. Please determine date to suit your convenience. Simultaneously, please then make necessary bookings from either date. I would prefer to spend one night in Zurich after arrival to rest after the Atlantic flight, and then proceed to Lugano the following day, if you are agreeable. So it would be fine to spend one night at whichever hotel you are staying at in Zurich. So I leave it to you, and am grateful for your making arrangements.

I had not told Edmund that you cated acted as my Power of Attorney, and of course will not do so now.

My old back trouble has returned and I am taking daily treatments for it. Things are going badly at the office and my spirit has been crushed (I was also turned down for a raise). The Indian operation goes from bad to worse and reflects unfavorably on me. I am burdened with a sense of hopelessness – aggravated by the study of Dan's papers and the seeming futility of his life and efforts – and by the realization of Buddha's teaching. All seems ashes to my gaze. And I suspect the LSD experience has opened the gate to something or other. I'm unable to mediate – or even think positively. I can only pray for help. - 1) September 30, Oct 19 (Dutch P.G.), 9 Oct, Nov 7, Dec 3 and 193 Jan 7. 68 plus lovely colors Xmas card plus Olympia machine details. It also expresses thanks for the thoughtfulness in sending the tie clip replacement, and for the Damart underwear. The latter is alright for size but in wear it did not prove warmer than ordinary flannel, still it is animal wool free, which I appreciate, also Vegetarian Hotel Book and {Beattle} clip The Italian phrase book has been a godsend
- 2) First I want to think you again for the generous hospitality at Locarno, and enjoyable too. Next the Astor Hotel was very comfortable, modern, clean, kindly, so I stayed there 3 months. But the meals proved too limited so I ate elsewhere. It is central in situation and was very¹⁹⁴ convenient.
- 3) Yes, I feel the Nancy chapter was to be closed, since it would not be beneficial to you but could lead to serious trouble. So please heed, as you say.
- 4) As regards the Swiss situation about which you talked to Edmund, I agree that it is better to let things remain as they are, which I too am doing
- 5) Yes I was caught by devaluation of \pounds despite several warning memos I had written to PB! But I was caught only 2 weeks before the date I intended to get action. Your company has had quite a blow. It shows that Britain's future is dark economically. Yes if you can take Romaine out before you leave, please do so, but don't tell her about my illness.
- (6) I would have come to Rome anyway for other reasons than the one you rightly guess, chiefly climatic. But the oily food soon laid me low, as it always does, when I always return again to the strict diet. But this time the couple of days sickness (usual) did not pass. Instead I got worse; then all appetite ceased. I could eat nothing, subsisted on very weak China green tea; the intestinal tract went dead from both ends. I took to my bed of course and stayed there 10 days, each day getting

weaker; finally when I became really alarmed, I prayed. A remarkable inner visionary & felt experience followed next day which restored hope strongly. Mail c/o Thos. Cook. I reside at Hotel Flora, 191 Via V. Veneto, am considering renting an apartment until my return to Suisse 1st July.

Two letters posted by you in India, dear Kenneth... arrived after you left me!

Yes I was discharged from the Clinic as cured and am now back to normal living, eating and strength, but there is a legacy of a swollen vein running through the calf of each leg: not bad enough to be varicose veins but still enough to weaken them, so that the physician prescribed elastic stockings. They are for walking and standing only. However they are a nuisance. Perhaps you could enquire for the following: There is a ladies stocking called "Supp-Hose which combines the two functions of support and appearance. I wonder if a similar item is made for men so that a single stocking would do the same (or half-hose, since it finishes below the knee) instead of having to wear double –one on the other. It (Supp-hose" is made by the Kayser-Roth Co. If so, I would send measurement size for an experimental pair. Thanks.

Now Evangeline-Noel has supplied the dates of the family's absence on vacation. They leave on July 15th and return on 15th August. This yields a whole month. But there is a snag .There is a German woman with a child coming to work for them next month as a help with Melody and the house. She takes her holiday from July 15 to August 1st then she returns and finishes it in the apartment when the family return. She worked some years ago for them but they could not get on with her and parted: they are better friends now so will try again. I met her and found her difficult and am not sure whether I want to stay there while she is there. I will have to consider it. On sunny days she spends several hours on the beach with her child so if we could be away in the evenings it might be endurable.

Anyway I suggest you arrive on the 16th July, the day after Eva leaves so that all will be organized by then. Secondly I will have to enquire for Beau's permission, as I have not told them yet, and to ensure that the bedroom space will be OK. By the time this is done I will make my decision as hotel space is hard to secure in summer if left too late, and I would make reservations for the July-August period and²¹¹ early September.

So I shall let you know as soon as possible about the August 1st decision & arrangement. Anyway we shall certainly be able to have two weeks minimum at the apartment and you are welcome there.

I have not decided yet about getting a permanent permit to stay in Italy, nor have I been to the Brisih [BRITISH] Consul to make the enquiries for you and myself, but plan going there in 2 or 3 days' time. Congratulations on PH successful year under your administration!

I've been back two weeks and am caught up at office and home, dear P.B.

catching up after a trip is almost as bad as preparing for one!

- 1) First, please let me thank you for your October 19 letter from Lyon, received in London and thank you for handling the L. matter. It is very satisfactory.
- 2) Edmund phoned me yesterday. We will dine together tonight. He asks me to convey his warm regards to you. His health is back to normal.
- 3) I'm still working on exact flight from Karachi to Milan. I'll leave Karachi sometime on Wednesday January 22—and may arrive Milan on Wednesday or the

next day. Anyway, I can definitely stay in Milan Thursday and Friday, (January 23 & 24) and leave Saturday (Jan 25) for London. I'll confirm flight as soon as I can—within a week at latest.

4) Well, despite our trepidations Bulgaria proved to be a delightful place and I felt very much at home there. Sofia is very clean and well-kept and well-illuminated. It has cheerful colors, many parks, plenty of trees on every street-and a charming atmosphere, rather reminiscent of Athens minus traffic and tourists! The Bulgarians are an intelligent race, superior to the Slavs, with an innate dignity. I found them friendly, smiling and just very nice. And (this will surprise you!) I didn't need my veg rations because there are many vegetarians in Bulgaria. Not only did every restaurant prepare a veg meal without hesitation or fuss (and openly say whether the veg soup was made from meat stock or not) but there is a large veg restaurant in Sofia. It was busy, plain but cheery. The waiter took me by the arm into the kitchen, and I just pointed at dishes I fancied. They were mostly from wheat and grain bases, and very tasty. After Italy, D found Bulgaria the easiest country for a veg. in Europe, much more so than Jugoslavia²³⁶ or Germany. After meals they take a few mixed spices in powder form; I brought a packet back, and they are delicious. Yoghurt,²³⁷ of course, was available everywhere in many forms.

I saw no signs of secret police anywhere, and was quite free to go anywhere and talk to anyone. Bulgaria has 180,000 English tourists a year; they pass a day or so in Sofia on way to Black sea resorts. And there was none of the blatant propaganda exhibits or signs in the streets one sees at Leipzig. The Bulgarians were quite open in their conversations: one publisher told me, "We have to be friends with Russia—whatever their political system, we'll follow it. We're too small and vulnerable to be without a protector; American is too far away, England has no power, and we don't trust Germany." Others told me about the feudal system under King Boris, when only a handful had wealth and power, and the rest were peasants. The lot of the common people has improved immeasurably. On the other hand, I was also told about secret labour camps in the interior for those who are too outspoken against the regime.

On the religious front, the Orthodox Bulgarian Church (similar to Greek & Russian orthodox) carries on openly; I went to Sunday morning service at the Alexander Nevsky cathedral, with a magnificent choir. Other religio groups are not encouraged, but tolerated to a large degree. For instance, I met a woman writer, also vegetarian, who belonged to an occult' group. Their teacher was Peter Dunoff. She gave me a booklet written by him and published in Sofia in 1929. He talks about the White Light within, and the power of Love—but it is not too profound. She told me there are many other groups in Bulgaria.

One day they took us (exhibitors at the Book Fair) to Rila Monastery, about 50 miles from Sofia, founded in 11th century. It is now a museum, but I was told there are still several other functioning monasteries, with monks, in Bulgaria. The Book Fair was

very well organized; I'm writing an article about it and will send you a copy separately.

Above all, I felt a great happiness inwardly in Sofia—like that I felt in Burma. On the Saturday afternoon I went to the vegrest for lunch by myself, then wandered about the streets and my inner being was suffused with happiness. At night I would look out my window at the inky hills in the distance over the rooftops, and experienced a strong feeling of kinship. So, I suppose like Burma, Bulgaria also brings back vestiges of a happy incarnation spent there? I would be happy to live there even today.

I did not like Belgrade or Zagreb. The towns were ugly and barren of charm, the people like animals after the Bulgarians. We fele flew to Dubrovnik for the weekend, a lovely sunny climate with gorgeous sea views. But the old walled town was too medieval for my sensitivity—as was Venice the following week. I liked Trieste, although it was not outstanding. Economically Jugoslavia is booming, no restrictions on imports, it was quite like a western country. They were quite open in saying that if Russia invaded, they would fight.

In Bulgaria, they excused the Czech invasion as "realpolitik" and compared it with U.S. intervention in Dominican Republic Korea and Vietnam. But a journalist there also told me that the Chinese are assembling missiles in Albania, short-range ones, but a frightening thought!

Mother and Len were quite well. They asked after you and your health. I had a pleasant week with them and got along very well with them.

I carry happy memories of our holiday together, particularly in Geneva. I enjoyed our time together very much, and am very grateful for it.

All is well at the office and on all other fronts. Mr. Riley sends his best respects to you. He has been enjoying having me home all day and playing with me.

Thank you again for everything. I look forward to seening you in Milan.

If you received my previous 2²⁴⁷ communications, dear Kenneth--- you were given the Diano Marina address. Well I moved from there yesterday to Alassio, at the hotel above. No letter was in the Poste Restante from you during my visit there, and the P.O. will forward one here should it come.

Outside the wind is howling, a storm blew all night, and it is quite cold: fortunately no snow apparently falls here; like many Italian hotels, the heating here is quite poor; they lack fuel, or it costs more than they like to spend; but to balance this they are quite agreeable to prepare my special diet, and the location within a 12/15 minutes from the sea!, inspiring on sunny days, when they come: it is good to see the ocean and walk the Manna (promenadi)

The Italians I have met in these Riviera hotels seem uninterested in "culture" so I am happy to have plenty of inner resources, work, etc to companion me, not to mention correspondence, if and when in the mood for it. I am 90 kilometers from Genoa, at what is the terminus of the resort stretch from French border. However I will later examine the coast resorts between Genoa and La Spezia, a much shorter length, but now I want to stay here for a few weeks as it is—Alassio has several positive features and I can get some good work done here, altho, noisy building work next door may necessitate changing hotels. Now to your letters. I wrote to Carol Collens but she sent me such an incoherent reply, so evasive, full of fear at

revealing what has happened that I am still largely in the dark. I wrote to Harold Stacey to look into the matter but he has been given little information of any use. I feel disinclined to get involved, but will decide shortly, but feel it better to ask Harold to get into the investigation again

I met Mr Wei Wu Wei but altho' he is only a year younger than I, his health is deplorable, and he seems 80 years old, and I could not get anything from the conversation to match the brilliance of his writing. I tried again a few days later (this was in Monte Carlo) but with even less good result. I must presume, therefore, that when he writes it is under the inspiration of some bright {illegible} philosopher, Chinese, in the spirit world. WWW does not care for India or its thought. Anyway I don't want to go again as I enjoyed my time at the Chinese Restaurant (I found an excellent one at Monte Carlo) far better than in his flat drinking tea. He will publish a new book called "Posthumous Pieces" in a few months' time, which seems to confirm my theory that it's a Chinese spook writing and not Mr Gray

Your experience of Bulgaria matches the favorable one of the late Professor Wood, who visited the {illegible} there. He enjoyed it too, and also got good vegetarian food Your article was excellent

Madras is not on our itinerary but should your itinerary take you there one day I have been told that there is a large well-run Hindu hotel which serves excellent vegetarian meals, is air conditioned Brahman but they let you – say your father was told he was one in previous birth! – name "The WOODLANDS"]

[My dear Kenneth,

There is a personal quandary surrounding me just now which I have difficulty in dealing with, living as I do among strangers and no friend here to turn to for advice. It is a matter requiring experience and knowledge which I don't possess.

Recently my investment in Kingdom of Belgium govt bonds was retired before maturity, so that I had to find a new source of income. My lawyer, at this point, came up with a proposal that I put the money in a mortgage. This would pay about 6% from which about 30% is deducted for tax, leaving 4%. He had no other proposal

He said the amount of cash I want to invest is too small to be considered by big clients, who won't trouble with any amount under 7 times as much.

Although he said the investment, being on the security of³³² property, would be safe, I am uncertain whether it is wise for me to enter an area in which I am totally inexperienced and of which I am really ignorant – I refer to mortgages.

This is why I am asking your advice; as a business executive of standing you know so much more about finance than a scholar and literary man like myself.

My fear is that if for any reason the lawyer's client fails to meet the interest due on mortgage, he would be threatened with foreclosure, which all means a legal messy situation that I dislike. Of course, that's merely a possibility

The lawyer says my other alternative is to invest in a Swiss Property Mutual Fund, but that interest is very low – about $1\frac{1}{2}$ % and it is also not easy to get in as they too are not keen on accepting small amounts.

However in both cases, a condition which I stipulated was agreeable.

Short of returning to the ordinary share market investment, I cannot see a way out I have not given a reply to my lawyer's proposal but he will wait for it.

He told me that Swiss share market suffered in the wake of the Wall Street drop in prices, so that Swiss bonds as well as Real Estate Mutuals have fallen down.

Well, if you have any advice I shall be grateful.

Yes, I am happy to advise you on your investment problem; thank you for bringing it to me. However, frankly I'm not sure what answer to give: the mortgage proposal of 6% (4% net after tax) is not overly attractive. After all you could reap 6% here in USA on a 2-year savings bank certificate. What bothers me more is the point you raise about foreclosure on the mortgage if the lawyer's client fails to meet the interest due; this, I presume, means they take over possession of the house. But, in bad times, they might be unable to resell the house to someone else? Then your investment might be frozen in an unsalable property? Admittedly it is only a possibility, but it is there, and thereby lessens the security of your investment. (Although I suppose the same could be true of a USA savings bank in a depression!) Did your lawyer mention on what terms (notice to be given in time) you could withdraw your investment?

I agree the Mutual Fund is even less attractive. If there is no urgent hurry, could I suggest that I consult a Swiss businessman of my acquaintance here in NYC? He knows the Swiss investment market and might be able to offer some ideas which I could then pass onto you. I will plan to see him in the next few weeks – and will then write you again after giving the matter further thought.

Incidentally, if you should visit Zurich, don't you have a banker friend there? He might be able to suggest an alternative investment possibility for you?

So, trusting the matter can wait, I'll write again in a few weeks' time.

And in two years' time, Bertie will retire from KLM at age 55, and they'll come to live with him at the Barlow House. He said I cheered him up by visiting him! Poor Hesper's "shrine room" has been dismantled and turned into a living room. Bobby said the doctor told him Hesper's death was a blessing in disguise else she would have developed complete paralysis within one year!
- (2) I have seamailed you a new PH book "Nightmare in Athens" by Margaret Papandreou (wife of Andreas.) I'm sorry our Trade division published it for it is blatant Communist one-sided propaganda. [Dear Mr. Goswani:

If there be only one Truth, then the visages it presents through its instruments must likewise be similar. Does not a common thread run through all religions, all philosophies?

Quite frankly I do not find it at all remarkable that two different people at different places come to the same ideas independently. How could it be otherwise – if they both find the real Truth? And what of all the others preceding Sri Aurobindo and Dr. Brunton who expressed the same ideas? Is Aurobindo thereby indebted to all who expressed them before <u>him</u> –or is it that they all drank from the same well of Truth?

The evolution of the superman was clearly stated by Madame H. P. Blavatsky ("The Secret Doctrine, Book I,) – published in 1888 – when Sri Aurobindo was only sixteen.

The "Overself" concept (called the "Oversoul" by Emerson, and the "Father" by Jesus) is ages old and prevalent in most ancient Eastern philosophies, and today in many Western schools such as Unity, and the Church of Religious Science, for instance.

I know of no special relationship between Dr. Brunton and Sri Aurobindo. Indeed, in several of his books,³³⁷ Dr. Brunton has acknowledged <u>Sri Ramana Maharshi</u> has his own guru. One might as well ask what was the indebtedness of these two peers and countrymen to each other? Maharshi and Aurobindo.)

I regret I cannot agree that Dr. Brunton has "kept himself aloof." He was a pioneer in presenting Yoga in terms suitable for modern Western³³⁸ living; he has fulfilled his outer mission by interpretating in his books ancient Indian philosophy to meet the needs of today's world; and he has pinpointed diagnosed the causes of the current world situation – and pointed to the remedies for them – in "The Spiritual Crisis of Man."

They have a list of 100,000 names & use a computer. They want to expand. Hand they refused I would have gone to {illegible}. The way I live is my affair, not his. I waited until today in hope of being able to complete news about my own financial situation. Of course If I wanted to withdraw in 2 or 3 years I could, but then the interest would be reduced by deduction 1 of 1/4 or 1/2%

[Thank you for the enjoyable visit with you, dear P.B. ..

I carry happy memories of it. Your new apartment is charming; I prefer it to the Lugano one. It is cozier. And your bedroom layout affords more space for an mi added "mini-living room." The whole effect is very nice and livable. I was also very pleased to find you in such good health - a tribute to your regimen over the years! (2) I was relieved to find things at home much better than I had expected. Len's health is the same but otherwise he is all right. If only he would help himself by taking a more active interest in things; it's a pity to see him just "waiting for the grave." He still reads though. I got them to agree to install central heating (at a £400 cost) and this will save them having to go out and shovel coal every morning. I think it's worth it for them, and will add to the value of the house. Mother was not nearly as bad as I feared; it's true she has slowed down considerably and her memory (shortrange) fails her, although she recalls details of her childhood. But otherwise she seems all right. She does not cook as she used to; in fact she will forget to prepare dinner, or part of it! But once she accepts this then otherwise she is normal. In fact, strangely, there is a certain sweet quality about it, akin to the "innocence of childhood." I had a long talk to Len about it. As you can see from enclosed letter, her mind wanders.

485 – 486 Letter to Kenneth from Jim Covell October 30, 1971

Dear Kenneth ...

At least 10 months after Tony Damiani was invited to take a vacation at PB's lodgings, Tony himself has written us [for the first time] about his visit there with Ella Mae. The results are generally what we hoped they would be.

In his quaint, flowery, sometimes high-flown and sometimes cryptic style, he describes [one] part of his confrontation with PB as "the most painful of all: dismantling the mana projection, i.e. the guru archetype, a really delicate psychological operation that requires love and veneration."

With all due allowance for the rather complex wording of a rather simple injunction, it is a tremendous relief to learn he has gotten help in removing self-imposed and ultimately self-defeating demands upon his energies and resources to practice the quest in the way he feels essential.

There was no hint in the letter that the complexities he has gotten involved in might have caused PB embarrassment and given others a false impression of the

way PB has conceived as the best one to follow. What that way ought to be is [part of] the object of our search. I am indebted to Tony for his help in getting a better conception of what it is – or is not.

Besides being told to stop acting like a guru, he was prevailed upon to conserve his energy and withdraw from <u>some</u> of the teaching. So he has handed the hidden teaching class over to some professor and the astrology to another gentleman.

Further, they have abandoned the West State street address³⁷⁹ of the bookstore. Two features of the new location (which Tony did not volunteer the address of) are more elegant quarters and lower rent.

It is plain from serious [and careful] perusal of this letter that continuing his operations in <u>any</u> quarters is <u>not</u> consistent with what PB has in mind. Tony himself says he has struck a compromise between PB's suggestions, Tony's own ideas and the provisions of circumstances. Not having succeeded in inducing him to get out of the [guru] business [*{Stephen handles the commercial business in the bookstore which is not in question)] altogether, PB has nevertheless persuaded him to tone it down. This may keep him off a collision course with disaster or death. It may also help to keep Ella Mae from being run ragged. She was overworked, understaffed and underpaid.

The smaller quarters preclude large groups. Tony now places the emphasis on quality and selectivity – whatever <u>that</u> is.

Here is how I came to be the lucky recipient of this letter.

Bert Salmirs wrote me in August that Tony had resumed his activities with increasing vigor. Tony's letter does not seem to bear this out. But however – Thinking that this meant PB's objections might have been withdrawn, and gathering from Bert's reaction to my letters to him that I failed to appreciate Tony's admirable qualifications for the task, I decided to send him the modest sum of \$50 to pay for the expense of my stay for five days at his house in May 1970. After reading Charley Mirra's sad story, I did not wish to have Tony feel that I had run out on him (he so obviously wished me to locate in his vicinity) and ran up an unpaid hotel bill in his house.

Tony wrote that they underestimated the cost of moving the bookstore. But my contribution (which I designated not as a debt paid for living on him but as a token of my support in his 'great' work) along with that of other "old-timers" from the questers, as he put it, got them out of the red and into the black. He says the bookstore is now running at a profit.

This whole experience has been most enlightening. However, except for this report to you on the outcome of the interview between PB and Tony and Ella Mae, I am imposing a year of silence on the matter on myself. If, at the end of that time, there seems to be an occasion to write Tony or discuss the matter in a letter to Charley, I shall [re]consider the whole subject then. Meanwhile, I prefer to keep out of the entire affair and comment them all to the Overself.
