Readers' Letters 11 (Notable Persons)

Editor's Note: The Readers' Letters files consist of correspondence between PB and his students, followers, fellow philosophers, spiritual leaders, friends and family. Most of these letters were sent to PB by readers of his books. They are in no particular order, and there may be letters by the same person in other files as well. Most of the letters in this file were written between 1926 and 1963.

PB had a tendency to make edits, write notes regarding his replies, or insert address information and meeting times on the letters themselves after receipt. We have noted PB's insertions and marginalia, but have not noted edits made by the original author, assuming that they were corrections made at the same time as the rest of the letter. To preserve both readability and the voice of the author, we have corrected spelling errors but have generally left grammar as is.

Less interesting letters have been summarized instead of fully transcribed. Please refer to the scanned PDFs for the full content, or to view all stationary headers, postmarks, unidentified markings, marginalia, etc. Proper names and dates have been written exactly as found in the original for each letter in this file; where we discovered multiple versions of a person's name, we have noted the full name either in the body of the text in {curly brackets} or in a footnote.

In many letters, there are words that are illegible or missing; in such cases we have included either our best guess or the word "illegible" inside {curly brackets}. In rare circumstances, we have added a word or phrase to a letter for readability, which are also noted with {curly brackets}; a footnote was added where we deemed it helpful. – Timothy Smith (TJS), 2020

My Master,

My 2nd son T. Natarajan who was working as a medical representative for 2 years in I.C.B. {I. ltd} Bangalore was obliged to resign it as the terms were bad. Dear Respected Dr Brunton,

I am deeply indebted to you for the kind and loving enquiring you made of me in your letter to Mr Chinnathambi. I consider this as a sign of Sri Bhagavan's Grace, a ray of hope for me during the immediate future.

I earnestly hope and pray that you are in your best health. Here, I am now a much reduced man, - I had to undergo severe-bodily strain. But my general health is not bad. My son and daughter are also doing well. Owing to the summer heat, my wife's health is indifferent. Our real misery is the poor nourishment I could {eak} out for the family.

When you were here last, I thought you would be continuing to stay for a pretty good time. It is Sri Bhagavan's inner presence that always drew you here and it is He that binds us in mutual love and regard. On the foundation of this inner mutual understanding, I do cherish the hope that you will one day play an important part in the future development of the Ashram. I shall therefore always be happy $\{to\}^{14}$ know that you would be coming here soon. May Sri Bhagavan's Grace bring you here early! At present the Ashram affairs are bad indeed. Devotees who have served Sri Bhagavan and the institution for years together are now outside the Ashram. Among these are Sri Krisnaswamy (who served and attended on Sri Bhagavan for over 15 years) Ravgaswamy (15 years) Shivanandan (12 years) myself (over 30 years) Monnaswamy

({14} years) and some others like Anjaneyalu and Vankata Ratnam who served Him for 5 years or more. The day-to-day management of the Ashram is in the hands of the only son of Niranjanananda Swamy, we call him VENKITTU, a consummate scoundrel, before whom Iago will find himself a play boy.

Venkittu has no sort of spiritual aspiration, nor has be any education worth the name. He has no cultural development at all in his life. He is about 40 and has 7 children. He has misappropriated huge sums of money belonging to the institution. Of Sri Bhagavan's teaching, he knows next to nothing. His interest consists exclusively in grabbing money for himself and his family and for harming others who seek to lead an honest life outside the Ashram. Even as a boy Venkittu received a lot of help from me, but now he laughs at my poor life. I therefore turn to you who is physically far away, than to Venkittu who¹⁵ is always here and would do anything to harm the interests of the old devotees of Sri Bhagavan. Under these circumstances I beg of you that you may render me and my family some substantial financial help for which we shall always be grateful to you.

In the near future. The Madras {illegible} may take up the management of the Temple of Sri {Maton bhuto nara} and make a demand for the assets dedicated by the Sage to the Idols.

There is one more important news for one to convey to you - namely - Monna Swamy, who was responsible for the latter day growth of the Ashram and also for the {illegible} proceedings re: the temple, - has been on a fast since the 3rd of March. He has built for himself an Ashram or Cottage just opposite Sri Ramanasramana. As far as I can gather, he proposes to continue the {fast}, notwithstanding the danger to his life, till the Ashram management actually accrues to the benefit of those who served the Sage the best part of that life. When that comes about, I would get some relief.

I am therefore now awaiting your kind financial help. Please do render it in the name of Sri Bhagavan!





Letter from M. to Raphael²⁴ 'Clouds' Telscombe Road, Peacehaven Sussex, England²⁵ January 25, 1931

Dear Raphael:,

Your welcome letter of Dec. 3rd., was read with great interest. I was right in that I was able to see - and told Aileen - regarding money and trouble with someone.

We have been living very quietly here at Peacehaven and I have done a great deal on my book. It is something for the Western world and scientific as well adapted for the Yoga of western bodies. It contains some new discoveries for serious students. The Great Atlantian-the Teacher of my Master has given me help and has opened a new door for me to explore.

The work is for our Western area and the 'Atlantian' and my Master are now in America living in the mountains in California.

America has a great future in store for The Atlantian has been for a long time bringing into America bodies which have a singular type of Atom in them which will respond when the time arrives for this new manifestation. They have with them the Brother's Teraphin - a relic of Atlantian days and it has the Nous Atom of a Brother in its substance who is related to me.

This is to be given to me, as its instruction is needed and one can get its vibration at times.

Starr seemed very much upset when he heard that you had gone to India. I wonder if he has not been wrong in what he has told me about His Holiness M.B. - that is regarding instruction for I do not think that he knows the first principal of Yoga practice if it is of M.B.'s teaching it is not of the type of Instruction fitted²⁶ for the Western minds, for no Master would give out the teaching which Starr impressed me to think was that of M.B.

This is confidential. Margaret seems to be the strength of his retreat. The Editor of the O.R. has written that he has fallen out of the good graces of Starr - it is so foolish to quarrel about who should hold the Cup.

I was told about M.B. 18 - 20 years ago after the Head of the Bahai cult - Sir Abdul Baha Abbas el Bahai visited me here in London -- and shown a clear vision of a young man about 18 years of age and told many things about him. Is it not strange that you are to be with him? If he has any messages for me as Starr said he had, I would like to know what it is? The trip to Combe Martin was not very fertile as you know.

Michael came down here for Christmas and did not bring a good atmosphere to the place. He wished us to ask the Girl but we told him that we did not possess a bed or bedding for a fourth person and that we were not in a position to entertain - being out of work and no income coming in. Much as we love him we think a little hard work would give him some knowledge of life and the character of people who work. We did everything to make him comfortable and happy but he would argue and it made us very desperate at times.

His personality puts people off and when Cynthia was here with her parents - they lived near us - they were very kind to Michael - but²⁷ Michael would sit beside the Girl and push his body against her so that she asked him to stop - such things embarrassed us and the girl - we do not mind what takes place behind closed doors - but anyone objects to love making in the open - it is not done here in England by people of Cynthia's class. I have often given him advice of this kind but he seems to know better - in fact he will not listen to this type of advice. At this time when he would constantly shove his body against her he had only known the Girl for three days, and it embarrassed her very much.

He thinks that happiness will come from sex satisfaction and marriage and that he should have it in order to do any creative work. I told him to get a job and not run about talking to half-wits in bookshops - the people he usually finds idle there.

You will think me perhaps very hard on Michael but he will not work - is lazy and idle and it is time that he should work and associate with men who work hard and

put their minds upon the thing that they are doing and not run about talking about their souls.



Dear Sir,

I have just read your book "Discover Yourself," and although I found it very interesting I did not find the all-important thing I was looking for only that you had attempted to rid your mind permanently of the ego. You regard the ego as being an indispensable part of the human consciousness but I have proved the truth of the contention of one psychologist that it is a false self, the one great illusion we have to recognise and eliminate. When this year I read a book entitled "World without frontiers" by Richard Weiss I found the answer to all my fruitless searching. I had for some years been able to enter the yoga state at will. I learned it by intuition and it was not at all difficult so I must have practiced it in former lives. As soon as I read of the method in this book I put it to the test. I entered into a deep intense state of concentration banishing thought. I then concentrated on this ego in the mind and I mentally said to it coldly and impartially "you are afraid." I did not tell it to go. I faced it with the truth. I held this for perhaps a minute and then relaxed, nothing happened immediately³⁶ so I got up and took a few steps, when suddenly a complete heavy inner body fell away from me and I felt indescribably light and detached like some ethereal being. Next I was aware that my mind was changing. I could almost see the picture of that perfect mechanism switching from dual control to a single unit. I had to gather all my courage then to keep my bearings, but later I went to bed and slept soundly. The next day I saw a different world, a far more beautiful one for I saw it in a new dimension, and for the first time in my life I felt "at home" in it. That is, I felt I was in an invisible company of love and goodwill. The thing which had conditioned my sight and my thinking had gone forever. The immortal friend within was not found in the yoga state but revealed Itself suddenly as a divine and beautiful river flowing through the heart. In the month since my mind has become more and more detached from my physical self and I have no doubt this freeing process will go on. I have from time to time had to suffer nerve pains in the head and neck. Unknown friend, if this new discovery had not come to your notice, please {reflect} on this and don't be deceived by its simplicity.³⁷ I do not write to you across the world to tell you a fairy tale. I lost a very substantial body. What it was I do not know, but I know that those who have not slain their ego with the objective truth are still hampered by that body, they still live in a three-dimensional world. If they identify themselves with the divine and try to ignore the ego they are using their imagination to change the pattern of the mind by imposing

another condition on it. But when the ego goes into a blaze of pure energy there is a new unconditioned mind. It has the simplicity and attractive quality of a child plus all the wisdom one has been able to gather during life. But there is all the repressed energy to be released and dispersed and we learn the marvellous manner in which the life force deals with this problem. We can trust to this kind thing which has always run our bodies even under the handicap of a personal ego. There is no doubt in my mind that this step up in evolution has been the unconscious goal of all the mystical practices of the centuries. The mystics of the past thought they attained Truth and they were right. But as the³⁸ mind of man evolves a new Truth reveals itself to his widening gaze. So that in this way we might say that Reality itself evolves.

My dear Paul Brunton,

At the moment you are under a series of adverse influences of an inner order, which will be in operation (until September of 1937,) during which period, Karma will tend to press heavy and hard upon you. There is a large field to be delved in the <u>esoteric</u> love side of Christianity, which later you may be used to expound to the helping of innumerable souls, your horoscope indicating a peculiar power of being <u>used</u> in this connection, if you (the person) so will. For a while, you <u>will</u> have to play the part of a "leaning post" to many, its a part of you job, however distasteful it may be personally, I feel that you will do it and all will be <u>well</u>.

I have no flair for writing, so have published nothing, my forte seems to be by <u>personal</u> contact, (a relic of my Egyptian priest incarnations), and lecturing. Karma fixes me in London, much as I desire to travel to Egypt so R.K squats here, and carries on. Your book "Secret Path" is one that is of <u>very</u> great service in a <u>special</u> way to many people, also the others have done much good. Those who are behind you, have yet much to <u>give</u>, through you, <u>when</u> the time is <u>ripe</u>.



Dear Paul,

I had received your letter from three weeks ago, but sorry, I could not answer earlier as I was busy; - busy in my own way of acquiring knowledge, not anything else-.

Dear Paul, I am realised, that philosophy, theology and Co. are names of a high science, which leads one to the knowledge of the truth. But unhappily, this truth remained a kind of nonsense?, unless it is based on a true science. What could be this true science? So it a mere meditation, or contemplation of a high Being; a kind of feeling that <<we>we are>>, or of realising that some thing makes us live, move, love, and understand? Or is it some thing much higher than all these? Yes dear Paul, true science, has completely changed today. I am not a conservatist; I am not seeking true science in a heap of old Ideas, and in books full of all kinds of sham truths; nor am I

seeking a man, full of understanding and wisdom, and knowing some thing about reality! All these are mere nonsense to me. The world is going onward, and tomorrow is better than today, and so on for ever and ever. Also the man of tomorrow, is better than the man of today. Why then, should we look for some old men, to find in them, what would be of no use to us today. Are you seeing that some man would be better acquainted than yourself? Why should you accept, to be a parasite to others? Dear Paul, it is just the time now, that every body, should be a self-supplying, and quite independent from others. You are a man! That is enough for you! Would you be better than a man, don't look for a man, to make you better than a man. A man is a man; and never, could a man make of you something better than you are. Keep well this in your mind. And don't trouble yourself, to find the true science outside yourself.82 And the truth of others, are good for other's, but not for you; and your truth is good for yourself, but not for other's. This is the basis of true science. Your lunch is for your own stomach, and your own⁸³ life. Is it of use for a hungry man, seating near, and looking at you, (at your lunch), is it enough to see you eating, and then he boasts that he saw you eating, and then pretend, that he gained some strength and power? Never! This is in our physical life; and so is our philosophical and metaphysical life. Every one for himself. And we should beware of being parasites to others.

Is your life, and all the universe, seem to you so strained, that you find it so difficult for you, to walk through it, unless helped by someone? Why are you so short-sighted toward yourself. Did you find in others, what you did not find in yourself? If so, it is your own mistake, - mistake to trust others, and distrust yourself. What a shame! Yes it is shameful dear Paul, to believe in others, and doubt about your self.

Dear Paul, if you believe, that you are a beast, is much better, than to let others make you believe, that you are something else. Why should you distrust yourself, to believe what others say about you.

Then, if you stand back alone, you doubt about what you must to believe i.e. I am a beast (which is your own idea about yourself) or am I something else (which is what others say about you). It is a sore condition, and a situation of doubt and mistrust. But were you leaving others, and rely upon your-self, you would be happy to believe in your self, even so this belief (that you are a beast) is not a quite fair a belief, but you are believing, and left others, be what they would be; then you ascend to this self in studying it carefully; you will find that you are not a beast, but something better. You must use your own telescope, and your own spectrograph; every own has his own sky, his own {some} of truth; be glad to discover it in your own gallant way; use your own apparatus; and a day come, when you will find the truth's waves, which could make your apparatus talk and song; and further, you will find, that you are seeing some photons, sparkling on it; and further, with your strong will, and forbearance, you find

later, that your own apparatus, is graphing to you, the best pictures⁸⁴ of the whole truth. This is the wise path in searching true science.

Why be guided by others, in a subject of your own? Can others feel what you are feeling, best that you feel it your self? Never! Well, this85 life is a privilege to you; everyone has his own privilege. No man would have two privileges, his and other's. But man can have no privilege at all, when he gives his, to others. As in a huge factory, where there are many busy-men; every one holds a job, no one could have two jobs at a same time; but many of them, could lose theirs, if they have no practice about it; and that is in trusting others, and handling to them, blindly, their jobs; thinking that they could help them, in showing them how to work; but suddenly, who his clever, and holds the jobs of others, is promoted in the factory, and those who trusted him, find themselves outside their jobs, in finding that they have nothing to do, and their hand empty; and come the owner of the factory, who has promoted the clever busy-man, and return back without, even, asking those idle workers, what they are doing in his factory; he knows that there are many onlookers, and thought of them as onlookers; not as men, who came to earn their leaving, with their privilege, to enter the factory as workers. Or just as in physics, when two atoms, wish to be alike, and remain free, they must preserve their state of stability in temperature; but what could happen, to the atom, which, could not resist the temperature? He is, suddenly, losing some electrons, which revolves about its nucleus, and are the cause of its freedom; and these electrons join the electrons of the other atom, which, this {last} in gaining much electrons, has become much stronger negatively, and has had the power, now, to join to itself all the atom which has become weaker negatively, in not resisting the temperature, which has been resisted by the former atom, of the same element. So, if we would not be attracted, we must try to be neutral, to be free, and not be attracted by the others, which become stronger in their turn, in attracting us to them and they are free, but we become nil, after have been in bondage.

In studying the simplest fact in nature, you could have a clear idea about our own fact. In speaking about true science, our first step must be freedom, and complete independence. Leave all others and think about yourself. Don't rely upon the Teachings of others; but upon your own teachings;⁸⁶ (are your teachings unworthy? Make them useful.) And be master of yourself; but in thinking, that your self, is not enough productive, to supply you all you need; this very idea, is the cause of your weakness, and the⁸⁷ cause of your fall. And for that, you find others stronger than you. Are you not of the same stuff, but only you differ in shape? Break down the shape which you find it unfair, and build a new one; as the stuff, here, is of a kind, which could be rebuilt a million of times, without losing any thing of its quality. Be as a boy, playing with a heap of snow; he can make the shape of anything he wants, before the

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snow is melted. He can make the shape of a cow, as he can make the shape of a bird; he is only playing, in materialising his imaginations; but once the snow is melted, he must never stay onlooking, and pretend, that he can not make a shape of a thing, with melted snow. But he must be clever, and use the water as something better than snow; because he can unite his {skatings} together, and make a small boat; and makes a tour on water, which could reveal to him, a new stuff, from which, he can make a toy and more, but perhaps these toys are more lasting than the fist made of snow. It would be a waste of your time, if you would read all I could write you, about this subject. For that, I find myself obliged to refrain. But I wish you know, that all is good in this universe; this is the basis of true science, and the general law of nature; law for the simplest bodies, which build up an atom, and law to the largest bodies, which radiate out all kinds of energies. Nothing is bad, so what you do, and think what you think, all is good. Don't worry yourself to the better; you are better than you think. And it is our fitness, and dispositions, which push us forward, to know the truth.

But the truth is a path, in which we are walking, and the axiom of the true science, is, to know, that we walk in the truth's way; and all what we do is marvel. If there is a sacred thing in this world, and a think which is true; what can you show me, which would be not sacred, and not true, in this world? Nothing! All is sacred, and all is true! Throw away the Idea of some {monopolistes} who pretends to hide⁸⁸ the truth in their hearts, and they had found it, and you will find far from them, the shining truth of nature and of God. And where you walk, you will find it sparkling, and brilliantly shining, in the heart of everything,⁸⁹ yes you will find it in the heart of the shortest wave and in the heart of the biggest particle; in inert and active matter.

And dear Paul I wish you all I wish myself to be.

If I done some mistakes, or I {wrote} some {absurdities}, is not a {shame} to me, as I am a layman. But it is shameful, to recede from my way, of free thinking, and from sincerity. If to say my thoughts would be not {ripe}, or even absurd, tomorrow they would be worth of writing.

And I am very, sure that they would be; if not in my life, it would be after my death. But happy am I and very happy, to have an aim, in this life, and should reach it, and even my death, would be a help to me to reach it.

Dear Paul

I am very glad to have in hand your letter of 12-5/37 as an answer on my letter of last December. You have known that I was fond of writing but I could not know how to make a first start. As writing is nearly the only thing by which one can explain himself to other in writing down his own feeling about truth and {Cie}. I tried to write several articles but dare not send them to newspaper to be printed as I was sure they could be of no interest, or else, could be of no importance as they are not send by remarkable people which newspapers are always interested with. I tried to gain some fame by which I could make myself well known to newspapers' men and to the public in general. That was the only way to get a manageable pen by the several articles written or the answer by which I am defending my ideas. But as this could not be done through philosophy and {Ci}, I tried another one which is that of the languages. The Arabic

language is written without vocals; and is the most difficult language, for the lack of vowels which are always missed in public writings, and the newspaper etc. Some people tried to do something⁹⁰ in creating new ways by which the Arabic could be written with vocals without being obliged, as is the case, to write the vocals over or under the consonants as you can see them for instance in the Quran. But this new ways are not of great use as they will make the Arabic more difficult in writing. Then and only in 16-11-{26} I began to create a quite new method based {mainly} on good reason and necessity by which the Arabic could be written with consonants uniting to them their vocals. And the way is very good and easy and of great advantage. I was going to make it known; but I feared to be discouraged by some opponents. I tried another thing, that is, to transform my new Arabic alphabet in an International alphabet; and I done it, and I am preparing the book for the print. By my international alphabet you can write the Arabic, the English, French, German, Italian etc. down with their right pronounce in same time as you write down their letters, that is if you are translating in Int. writing the word: enough, right, blood; you write both at a same time, the pronounce and the spelling of the words, which is very important to all people. As the great difficulty in studying a language is that of the pronounce by which an -o- for instance in English is of different pronounce in these different words: women, some, blood, move, loose, etc. and so is the -ch- for instance in: cholera, chivalry, children, In German: acht, machen, ich mich etc. all this is trustfully translated in pronounce and spelling through my international alphabet which is to be patented after some days. By this way I will have many opponents which I must resist their criticism by writing down my defence and so I can gain a good practice in writing and then I will be free to care about a new philosophy. It is a life of meditation and foresight, and study how to connect true {Ideas}, and relate them {me}⁹¹ after the other as to become a very record of divine news which could be available to society. Man can write much and be a great writer but it is not all. Society needs not much writing in this modern times in which <<time is life>> and no time to much reading some books, which, first, at an earlier age was a good pastime.
