# Readers' Letters 24 (Anthony Damiani and Students)

Editor's Note: The Readers' Letters files consist of correspondence between PB and his students, followers, fellow philosophers, spiritual leaders, friends and family. Most of these letters were sent to PB by readers of his books. They are in no particular order, and there may be letters by the same person in other files as well. Most of the letters in this file were written between 1965 and 1981.

Anthony Damiani was a lifelong student under the tutelage of Paul Brunton from the mid 1940's until PB died in 1981. Anthony had interest in and proclivities towards the arts, philosophy, and mysticism from the time he was a young boy. He met PB while putting up a display of PB's books in the window of Brentano's where he worked as a buyer of rare books. Thereafter he joined the circle of PB students in New York mentioned in the note about Jim Covell. He and his wife Ella May hosted PB's son Kenneth for a time when Kenneth was out of work and homeless in NYC. Under PB's guidance Anthony's interests in philosophy and meditation flourished in deep and meaningful ways. Anthony started a comparative philosophy and meditation centre in 1971 in upstate New York, Wisdom's Goldenrod which focused on philosophy, esoteric studies (including astrology), and meditation along with PB's writings. Anthony's unique vision involved the unity of all the great philosophies yet retaining their very real differences.

There are three sets of letters relating to Anthony in the archive: this one (Readers' Letters 24) is from his earliest years with PB, and include some oblique references to the family's move from NYC to California and back again (they only stayed long enough for their third son Paul to be born there). The second set of letters (Damiani Letters) is from near the end of his life and have to do with the creation of Wisdom's Goldenrod; the third set (Damiani Letters – Family) has to do with a personal crisis he experienced in his lattermost years – these have been sealed for 25 years at the request of the family.

PB had a tendency to make edits, write notes regarding his replies, or insert address information and meeting times on the letters themselves after receipt. We have noted PB's insertions and marginalia, but have not noted edits made by the original author, assuming that they were corrections made at the same time as the rest of the letter. To preserve both readability and the voice of the author, we have corrected spelling errors but have generally left grammar as is.

Less interesting letters have been summarized instead of fully transcribed. Please refer to the scanned PDFs for the full content, or to view all stationary headers, postmarks, unidentified markings, marginalia, etc. Proper names and dates have been written exactly as found in the original for each letter in this file; where we discovered multiple versions of a person's name, we have noted the full name either in the body of the text in {curly brackets} or in a footnote.

In many letters, there are words that are illegible or missing; in such cases we have included either our best guess or the word "illegible" inside {curly brackets}. In rare circumstances, we have added a word or phrase to a letter for readability, which are also noted with {curly brackets}; a footnote was added where we deemed it helpful. – Timothy Smith (TJS), 2020

Letter to Barbara Plaisted from PB Jordil-A CH 1807 Blonay sur Vevey, Switzerland 4<sup>th</sup> December 1976

Dear Barbara Plaisted,

Thank you for your sending of September and will you also speak to Joyce Long and Linda Boldeck on my behalf. All is now satisfactory.

I must also thank you for having send the clip from the Mountain Path<sup>2</sup> written by Mrs Osborne. It was thoughtful of you. You mention that Tony has given you his explanation of the matter, but I don't know what it was. But also nor do I know what this Hungarian lady Edith Deri has told you after her visit to Ramanashram.

At present I have not the time to go into a lengthy detailed discussion of the whole matter, so I will simply give you the following information about a few essential points to help make it easier for you, if possible, as I have no wish or interest in getting

involved in a controversy with the Ashram, which is quite officially <del>and correctly</del> presenting Maharshi's<sup>4</sup> teachings to the world.

To go into detailed history of how Maharshi<sup>5</sup> came to be described as a mystic will take too long. I therefore simply inform you that for several years I have tried to get the publishers to withdraw in {friend} those homages which I say that he was a mystic or imply his was a second stage of realization. It has been difficult because the text of the particular and only book in which such matter came up was the Hidden Teaching Beyond Yoga. Purely through technical difficulties connected with the fact that the text has been {illegible}, many pages at a time. However it now seems that I have almost overcome the problem and before the end of the next 12 months these {deletions} will have been carried out in the printed version of that book.

You may therefore accept that Maharshi<sup>6</sup> is a Sage without any {illegible } on my part. I hope this helps you to unreservedly give your devotion to the Maharshi.<sup>7</sup>

Your question whether "a rejection of the guru is a necessary stage in order to find the Truth for oneself" can be immediately answered it is not<sup>8</sup> at all necessary to reject the guru at any stage.

Your surmise that if you move to the {cottage} in the country to live {thus} closer to Nature that it would benefit you is certainly correct. This is particularly true as regards finding quiet for study and meditation and for getting a less {illegible } environment.

If you wish to consult me further concerning the two {illegible } concerning the Maharshi<sup>10</sup> and the {illegible } difference you may write to me again.

You<sup>11</sup> inform me that the library for lending books is another development which is being planned by you and your friends. This looked as a suitable way to introduce the subject still {illegible } in the area until I met Dr Arthur Broekhuysen again and I informed him of what you're are planning to do. He then told me there is another aspect to it of which as a professional librarian himself he has had personal experience for instance both the Theosophical Society and the Krishnamurti movement had similar ideas and materialized them into action. The results were to create difficulties for themselves and not at all as they had hoped or expected them to be. Both found the results unsatisfactory and in the end had to present their libraries to a university. Furthermore Dr Rudolf Steiner's Anthroposophical Society decided from the very beginning that the most effective way was to put their book also in the university

Thank you very much, dear Barbara Plaisted, for the grey sweater on which a lightweight zipper was now sewn: it is very much easier now to wear and put on. Also for the pair of dickeys; both are usable and fit the throat quite well.

Your suggestion of not troubling with the tricky work of zippering the other 2 sweaters is excellent; replacing them instead with turtleneck cotton ribbing and sewing it to long front, short back cotton body. In that case one could be sleeveless, the other sleeved. However as you guessed white is not preferable; rather a quiet grey or something near it is a more suitable colour.

I will try the watering sticks on the plant very soon, having been away in Zurich for a couple of weeks, and not yet {withdrawn} plants from storage

Both soup ladles are effective, so please thank Mary Ann F. for them on my behalf.

If you have learnt anything here, after getting over the surprise of my great personal difference from the usually expected Hindu holy man type, the use made it in daily life itself is the best thanks. Spirituality should become naturalized, natural in its final effect, and simplified.

Dear PB

We have sent two packets with Om for you to look over. One of them is your paras, categories I-IX, and the other is some of the notes from your talks with us.<sup>12</sup>

As regard your paras, all 28 classes have been  $\{classed\}$  edited; we are in the stage of gluing them to  $81/2 \times 11$  sheets

We split the paras you let us take with us into two sets; The first set has been {illegible} and edited by {illegible possibly name} Devon and myself. The remaining categories – X through XXVIII need to be glued and Xeroxed, and then we'll send them to you. This shouldn't take more than a few weeks. Then we'll start on the 2<sup>nd</sup> batch, which we feel will go much faster. Use {care} send all the incomplete paras in a batch of envelopes, or glue them on 8½ x 11 sheets, whichever you prefer. We hope that our editorial work on these paras is helpful to you – that is what has taken the most time; if you need the 2<sup>nd</sup> batch faster, we'll reduce or stop the editorial work and simply {class}, sort and glue the paras, as I did while we were with you. Reading, and writing on the paras is a wonderful experience for us – we are learning something of the philosopher's view on life from it.

Our notes – what is sent is the first of two of three batches. When you have edited them and send them back, we'll read them to our group here – we'll  $\{also\}$  send the  $2^{nd}$  batch to you as soon as possible.

Anthony is getting along – all though there are still days when he is discouraged – my sense is that not everything is {resolved} yet, though there is little {turmoil} on the surface, and the group has weathered well. He is spending more time alone now – Avery has taken a large part of the class duties. When<sup>13</sup> we send the {illegible} paras, we'll keep a Xerox copy here until we've gotten acknowledgement of your receipt of them. Then, we can send the Xerox copies (of our edited work) if you like – of keep them here, or destroy them as you wish.

We have been working with Anthony in seminars on Plotinus and astrology. I have begun reading chars – about 6 a week – and am looking for a storefront in Ithaca, to open a center or front from Wisdom's Goldenrod – if you have any suggestions for a name, they would be welcome. Devon has just gotten a job at Cornell, so our "vacation" is drawing to a close.

My heart fills with joy, light and gratitude when I think of you, it is too much for me to find fitting words for all I feel. It would be so wonderful if we could be of assistance to you again – somewhere someday. We both hold dear to our hearts the hope that you might be able to come to America – perhaps Columbus Ohio, to continue your work. We believe such a place would allow much more efficiency and comfort in getting your literary work in order – and with practically no loss of privacy. A small house could be arranged so that you could meet with people in one room, (when needed) and keep the rest of the house in atmosphere of {illegible}. We do hope that you're not {losing time or risking health by not havinan assistant for cooking and shopping – perhaps soon someone from here (if there is no one in Europe already

- 1 Please come any date after 1<sup>st</sup> January. You should visit only. For a prolongation there are complications and difficulties but we can discuss this when you are here only.
- 2 On no account say that you want to work with me; that you are a school teacher seeking a combined holiday in Switz and seeking to brush up some French.
- 3 On no account mention my name or affairs. Ask for no explanation by telephone.

Sorry for all this uncertainty but it cannot be helped. It is not desirable for you to live in Corseaux so I expect to find you some place near Montreux instead, but all must be explained and discussed when we meet. The first move is to arrange your one-way journey, then inform me. We shall nave to meet for discussion before you may come to my residence. Make no plans other than a one-night lodging at a hotel or I could meet your train and take you to one.

Dear Ed,

Got the Hills book in the mail today, and I can't think of anything I've done in a long time that I've enjoyed as much as sitting down to write you this letter with the last line of your note in mind.

When Anthony first asked me about coming here, my immediate inner reaction was, "No, I like it right where I am." Then she got off the bus.

I hadn't "applied," and I really didn't feel any personal devotion toward PB. In the end I decided to come because Anthony asked me to.

After a few weeks here I began to realize that there must be someone else better qualified for what PB really needs most. But then as I went over his alternatives I realized that, except for you, there isn't anyone I know who would be better than I am here. So I've gone on with it, doing the best I can. In the meantime, I've learned a lot,

especially about who and what PB is. I've come to care a great deal for him and for his well-being, all the while realizing that my being here has from the beginning been much more to my own benefit than to his. What started out for me as a job I meant to do as well as possible has become a friendship rooted in reverence. I stand on my own feet, of course, as ever. But my heart warms each time someone<sup>14</sup> PB and I have met together asks me about my "father."

So today, when he asked me to go with him through the file of applications to help pick out who will replace me here, it wasn't long before my heart was saying, "PB, there's no one here as good as Ed." To make a long story short, if we were still into Zen, I would have stopped this letter at the end of the second paragraph and enclosed a new VMCV "carte au porteur."

If you want to come, you're on. If not, it's perfectly understood, by both of us. There are others who can manage, so you're not on the spot. At any rate, it wouldn't be until at least November, and maybe even three months later than that.

The point is simple: not only are you the best qualified for both sides of the job, but you have experience in knowing how to react to your own reactions to being with PB. And my own feeling is, where PB is concerned, try first for the best before settling for anything less.

This letter is, of course, entirely personal: no one other than you and I and PB will know anything of it unless you either tell them or decide to come. But we will wait to hear from you before going ahead with any other plans. I will be writing to Steve Smolen soon to get<sup>15</sup> more information about his skills, but that will be clearly just a "feeler." There is also a possibility of Michael Wakoff coming for a period of not more than three months (PB's limit, mot Michael's), so I will write him as well. But anything you hear about that from others – if anything at all – is entirely tentative.

Having gone this far, Ed, I have to go on and touch all the bases. PB had said earlier in the afternoon, "If Ed has been successful at his job, then they won't want to lose him, and they will probably grant him a leave." Then just before I left he mentioned, "So you will write to Ed, then?" I told him that yes of course I would. And he said "Since we all know each other, you can ask him directly." I said that as long as we were being frank I might as well admit that a very big issue for you during your period of having no income was the loss of financial security, and could understand your not wanting to risk getting back in the same boat. He said, "Well, we don't want to interfere with his financial security... but he got it as soon as he left here. As soon as he left here, he got what he wanted. It's up to him."

So. With all that said, a sort of "second Movement" mood comes on. What I thought was complete is apparently only a beginning. All the hesitations come forward as I realize what I'm in the process of owning up to.

As I sit here by my window on the lake, one of the tour boats is passing by, with lights, music, dancing. No doubt there are human beings on it who actually <u>are</u> enjoying themselves among the others who only feel as if they should be. It's been a very long time since I've been able to look about me for long and be truly satisfied with my circumstances... inclined to say, "Yes, this is where I want to be."

I'm not sure that I would come here again if the opportunity were presented. I'm not even entirely sure I want to stay here another day. Much of it is what I suspect a trip on a one-man spaceship would be like. If my visa were rejected (it still hasn't gone through), my only sadness would come from the thought of PB having either to go for a while without help or having to adjust again to someone else sooner than would have been necessary.

I won't miss the trolly busses on bit. I won't miss that ridiculous typewriter. I won't miss shopping, shopping, shopping, shopping with <u>never</u> enough time... and hardly ever getting anything that's more than "acceptable." I won't miss<sup>17</sup> the feeling of going deeper and deeper into debt each day for the sake of being allowed to go on being a less than adequate domestic servant.

But I will miss the satisfaction of seeing PB in good health, wearing clothes that aren't hopelessly wrinkled, free to go on working the work that if it went undone would leave us all even more hollow that we so often are... and knowing that I had something to do with that.

It would be so much easier if he would come to the States... and that, by the way, is still a possibility. So many of the seven day endless weeks would begin to make more sense if they were an arrow pointing him to Ithaca. I really don't think he realizes how hard it is for those of us who care about his wellbeing to give him what he wants under the conditions he sets. But then, those conditions may be more for what <u>we</u> need during the time we're here.

Whenever I'm inclined to complain or maybe even just to outright quit, I hear his voice inside me saying, "Philosophy demands much, but it gives much in return." But I don't admire the part of myself that would bargain, least of all with God. I guess that why I stay is because OB is someone <u>incredibly</u> special, and I just don't want to see him go. I can give six months to his way for what he's helped to make it possible for me to learn of my own.

Would<sup>18</sup> I come again? I don't know. But if I'd had two years to think about it, another plunge might look quite different than it does now.

The work load has changed. Most of the literary work PB intended to get done was finished by then end of my second month here, and PB just doesn't have the strength now to tackle any of the bigger projects. The secretarial work is minimal, but what little there is needs to be done well. Since his operation, PB frequently has trouble forming letters, remembering how to shape them, spell words, etc. He likes being able to just give out the idea and leave the composition of the letters to the secretary. All the physical-dependent functions (senses, memory, etc) are frequently tenuous, but the inner PB... well, you know. When he's able to shine through, I have <u>no</u> questions as to why I'm here or if I want to be. The most important part of the job is to do whatever needs to be done to help him be able to shine through more steadily. I can't think of better hands to put that in than yours.

If my own experience can be used as a measure, you'll have support if you want it. You'll certainly have mine, either way.

41 – 44 Letter from Bob to Ed Aug 8

Dear Ed.

I hope you are beginning to feel settled in your new life. PB wanted me to thank you for the dried vegetables. He wanted to pay you for your expenses, so here is \$5 from him. He wants to do some more research before he decides on what brand he will be getting, and he has asked Loraine, who already is familiar with some of the

companies, to follow up on the leads, so he said that you don't need to trouble yourself further – even though I know you'd be glad to. He like both the vegetables and the dolomite, but he says that what you sent will be plenty for a while, but he would like to know where you got the pills. Has there been any progress on the binders?

I am still doing fine, but I think the honeymoon is over, and the impersonal treatment is definitely taking over. He really treats my ego as an objective they and does not respond to it. Ordinary personal interactions are virtually absent. I come, matters are dealt with, and I go. A point which you brought up seems to have occurred with me. He told me he does not want me standing around waiting for instructions all the time (Remember the "waiters should wait episode?") He wants independent {initiative}, my own ideas, for me to generate my own work and my own approach to it. He sat me down on day after I<sup>19</sup> had again asked him if there was any think I could do, and said "Why do you keep asking me. If there is anything I need, I'll ask you," and he said it with a force I had never seen him exhibit. He then told me to do the work as I saw it needed to be done, and affirmed that I should work independently and use my own creative approach. I went home that night with a lot to think about, shaken up a bit by his directness. However the more I thought about it, the more glad I was that he had done it. It is the nature of my Ithaca job and the way I usually run my life to be expected to do work on my own without any supervision. My boss usually gives me a problem, and sends me away to solve it. I enjoy that latitude, and I really did feel uncomfortable standing around waiting for PB to do every thing for me, to tell me every little detail. The only difficultly now is that I'm not sure that I'm doing things according to his preferences or my samskaras, and he told me he wasn't going to criticize my work. I never know how I'm doing, unlike my Ithaca job, which gives me instant feedback, and it leaves me kind of uneasy.

Because of this setup, we rarely talk anymore since we are usually engaged on different projects in different rooms. You talked about it being quiet for you. This is a mouse's delight. As good as it is to be more on my own, I do miss the interaction with him.

It<sup>20</sup> is probably more efficient in terms of the amount of work we can get done by working on two projects at the same time, but the outward interaction, the little gems that he says every now and then come less often because there are fewer occasions for them. And his physical presence is not always there to remind you where you are and what you are involved in, so that outward inspiration is not as present. I mentioned before that I just had Uranus on Mercury. My Mercury symbol is the self-impregnated woman. Apparently that {classing} work on the notes is not what I thought it was. He has really just been giving me food for thought, kind of humouring me, letting me play around with his ideas. He has undermined a lot of the projections I had on him, but I've found new one, new ways to appreciate him. I can't really relate to him anymore because he won't let me. I have to relate to the work, my self, and my Self. It's a little

like cold shower, but hopefully it will wake me up a little. It really undercuts the projection that being with him will help you become a more spiritual person. It may, but you still have to do the work yourself. I do not question that I am <u>drowning</u> in Grace, but the way it works out I don't think is a simple equation.

This is turning out to be a longer letter than I had planned - continue on the back of page 1.

Anyway,<sup>21</sup> I'm {bungling} along, and despite what I have said so far in this letter, I do feel good. There is a keen sense of purpose that really makes me feel alive, awake. Enough about my feelings.

I would like you to handle a matter for me in Ithaca if you can find the time. Will you buy my plane ticket home for me and send it here (registered mail). I would like to return in mid-December, so try for Dec. 17, which will give me 2 weeks to acclimate, as Tony suggested. I came on Capital airlines and dealt with the stone travel agency on {Eddy} Street near {Cabbagetown}. They had the best air fare to Europe via Belgium (Brussels). Also include NYC to Ithaca on the ticket. Please do it soon because the air fares are going up Sept. 1. I also won't have to pay excess baggage back. I also won't have to lose the exchange rate. The Swiss travel agents also plead ignorance about this company (and Icelandic is twice as expensive from here.) Some years ago I acquired the file of correspondence sent to PB by Anthony's students. I had in fact previously worked on this material with PB during one of my visits with him. Subsequently I then took on the very-time consuming task of locating and notifying all of these individuals and of sending their correspondence back to them, which was completed approximately a year ago.

With these letters was a file in PB's handwriting titled "Anthony himself" which contained Anthony's personal letters to PB. Based on my conversations with PB, Anthony, members of the family, and many others, I was afraid that these letters might contain extremely personal and volatile information. Thus, I made the personal decision to read the letters first in order to get some ideas about what was in them and what might be appropriate to do with them.

Because of my hesitation and concern it took me some time to emotionally prepare myself to read them. When I finally did so I was pleasantly surprised as all of the correspondence is from the early days of the American Brahman Bookstore and of the development of Wisdom's Goldenrod, and they contain almost no personal information about Anthony and the family.

I know that in subsequent years many other confidential letters were written to PB by Anthony and his family members. I know this because I saw and organized these letters at PB's request when I was with him (without reading them) but I do not know what happened to them.

The letters do contain some confidential information about Anthony's students which Anthony disclosed to PB in these letters. It is my opinion that this information should not be shared with others, and I have therefore covered over these sections of the letters and copied them so that the copy does not contain the personal information. This had to be done for only a very few of the letters.

One copy of these has been sent to the Damiani family, c/o Louis Damiani. The originals are being sent to Wisdom's Goldenrod. I have also kept a copy for myself.







When I first started this store every disadvantage was at my disposal; except the essential. An exaggerated minimum of books for stock, no money to speak of, a certain fear or hostility from Ella May etc. etc.

Since<sup>73</sup> then the store has tripled its stock, purchases necessary for the {business} have been made and credit established.

Stephan, my eldest son operates the store full time, and although as yet draws no salary except whatever expenses are necessary, is quite happy in the doing. I am convinced he has grown considerably in the meantime and we have worked out a few psychological problems between us. He makes out the horoscopes and arranges the<sup>74</sup> necessary routine at the store leaving me free for the classes. His business like attitude is a necessary {front}. The fascination of your books has started. And he insists on having two shelves full of your titles. By the way they are our biggest sellers. If the reputation of your books spread it is by a very natural process; word of mouth. Of course other book stores have been forced to carry P.B. titles.

I do not indiscriminately recommend your titles but they do sell... I have found many of this younger generation with a spiritual hunger and impulse but without the necessary direction. I have seen with my own eyes youngsters transformed after reading and studying your writings. Please do not ask me to play down and deprive these people of your writings. P.B.<sup>75</sup> I do not know how to say or express this feeling, my imagination cannot leap so far in addition to my inability to speak or write you, there is this numinous reflex that blocks my spontaneity. I will remove your picture from among the others, representing these teachings... but only because you insist. Their transcendental hunger has removed some of my reserve. The store is building up small but representative and selective titles in Philosophy East and West, Yoga, Buddhism, Alchemy, Astrology, Psychology, Kabbalah, etc. Some popular items Tarot, Magic etc... but always in the background is the possibility that they may be influenced to higher things.

I<sup>76</sup> do not know if I am the cause of some of the misunderstanding about the sort of astrology that we are interested in doing at the store classes. But whatever the origin, it is proper for me to explain it to you in some detail - if then you believe our effort misguided - I will gladly {ceased} the class and the charting. When I say we, it includes besides myself and Dr {L. Silvers} a math professor at Cornell U, who is not exactly given to any exaggerated mode of expression; quite the Contrary, reserved and cautious in his approach. We have long ago recognised astrology's {fragmentary} character, and what has been handed down is only the residue of a vast wisdom and revelation beyond our understanding the astrological mandala incites our brains into an attempt to schematize and evolve some sort of understanding that can be 'objectively' validated.

[Ambitions], {rash}... but out approach isn't; on the contrary we are amazed at its grandeur and celestial implications. Most often we get taught by our inability to seize upon the various frames of significances operating simultaneously in one nativity; our understanding works retrospectively. We dare not predict. We have enormous difficulty in trying to locate meaning in the present, let alone the future. If there was a danger - at one time - it was represented <sup>78</sup> by Ramananda (alias {Bob Hanley} - who had written to you a very long letter) However he has left about the time I wrote you last. I regard his work in the store has subversive and I found it in opposition to mine. A very disturbing and almost nefarious influence which I had to undo. Especially the mythologizing... about past lives. I believe the lesson has been learned. Any deviation from the philosophic principles the store is dedicated to brings immediate reaction

I hope this very brief indication of how we are working in and with astrology settles the problem to the proper proportions.

We have free classes in the store three and four times a week.

One <sup>79</sup> night (Wed) is devoted to metaphysics and is preceded by group meditation, (which they have insisted upon.) for three hours the class is devoted in studying the Wisdom of the Overself.

Another night is concerned with the Hidden Teaching Beyond Yoga. Prof {Plateck} carries this class - (He teaches Symbolic Logic and Math at Cornell University.) With his very crisp and precise intellect; the presentation he makes often provokes the students to study further. I am sorry that he missed the opportunity of visiting you.

We<sup>80</sup> try to remain flexible - and at times when a sufficient number in the group request a follow up... we try to comply. Recently I had to 'summarize' Guenon, Schuon, Burkhardt, Coomaraswamy (modern traditionalist) On the other hand I had to retreat from an attempt at explaining Proclus. One of the neo-Platonist that truly requires a rigorous intellect... That whole tradition of positive<sup>81</sup> metaphysics is a grand monument dedicated to superimposing data from a transcendental source on to the intellect.

Perhaps my remarks may help you gain some position by which you can evaluate my direction. I may not succeed and probably won't but I will give it a good try. The ABB is sub-titled a bookstore for the Elite.

Eventually a certain dexterity is aroused from the ability to manipulate concepts and with it a tremendous re-evaluation of the entire cognitional apparatus - a sort of disenchantment with just thinking and the desire to go beyond productive imagination... the ground for meditation is concretized. A border situation has arisen -

for what can I tell them of meditation? {illegible} that happened to me is of such meagre value...

We<sup>82</sup> also conduct a class in Astrology. The royal we refers to Prof Silvers and myself. It demands of students psychological effort... That goes beyond {illegible}, Maslow, Adler, Jung etc. In these classes we attempt to break through the mythological structures with which we operate. At times one may suspect the class is using a Madhyamika approach... but actually an intense awareness of the qualities we operate through and with is a practical illustration of your remark from the 'Quest of Overself' we are not perceptions. Dr Silver is very devoted to your writings but has been unable to express himself in a letter to you... however I'm sure he will get to do so eventually.

It is a strange state of affairs that we find in our universities now a days. The artist, mathematician, writer and all sorts but philosophy majors are interested in these studies. The latter are still playing word games. Perhaps that may be one of the reasons they find your books refreshing. Metaphysical vision combined with creative vision and psychological insight...

At times we include series of lectures on C. Jung (excluding the alchemy portions for I find his formulations on this subject inadequate... and too psychological.) and his followers especially E {Neumann}, who in my judgement has gone a step beyond his teacher.

Enclosed<sup>83</sup> some photographs you requested, these were taken by {John L.} when he visited you.

I will return the notes that Romain left me to read - will you inform her?

I think you have received a letter from Jean {L.} Pauls requesting an interview, I do not know him personally but from what I have heard he seems to be a quiet, serious lad.

A strange series of incidents that brought me into contact with a group of people in Ohio deserves to be described. I will simply say that a small group of people there asked me to visit them and explain some portions of your books. By the very nature by which circumstances {illegible} themselves also arranged the possibility of my stay. It was the younger group that interested me. The promise of enthusiasm, will prejudice my outlook, all that I can say for now is that quite a few of them are sincerely interested. Of course it was to be expected that some seemed more concerned about your person than teachings. But I found this trait quite common<sup>84</sup> among seekers... I do not encourage it and at times find it necessary to tactfully switch tracks. They have started small groups that are studying systematically your earlier books. Another item that may interest you. Charles {illegible} and family are leaving for Ecuador. Last summer Charles and family spent a couple weeks {illegible}... circumstances had neatly arrange for his visit and I thought that he would settle in this area, for it seemed all the indications were pointing in that direction. Then suddenly decided against it. I refrained from the pros and cons... he seems to have settled into an organized immaturity I fear what he refuses to recognize inwardly as a psychological complex will be {illegible} outwardly as fate.

Jim Covell also paid us a visit early this summer - his intention was to get a position at Cornell University Library... and this was almost a certain possibility. This enormous library had definite need for his talents in languages. However he had but to wait two or three days for confirmation, and this he could not do... for that would have meant a re-arrangement of some plans, but most of all the inner {purity}, from which he operates prevents a free to easy access to life. All I could do was suggest, hint at...

I hesitate to speak so freely my dear, it might conjure up the image or archetype of you beloved... which you might think I wish to replace. Nothing could be further from the truth, for it is the common bond between us an without that how could rapport be established?

Yet on the other hand this is precisely the ground upon which you can build... The work you have done at the ashram can be put to use here, in Ithaca where there is need of just some sort of spiritual retreat. Your training and leadership qualities are very much in need, but without the commitment of your will it would be useless. I have found out in practise that when we are willing to help others we in turn are helped... and guided.

If you were to ask me to put as briefly as possible, to lay on the line so to speak my objective, it would go something like this. The true state of divine union is without

At your request, dear Anthony,

here is a summary of what I observed about Mrs Ybor, and what I suggested.

It is a series of mystical phenomena of different states of intensity and now extremely blissful and quite unworldly. The light phenomena have also dazzled her.

These happenings, have gone on for some years, have taken her on upward flights on what seems infinite space and glorious heavens. However the physical distress and pain which also recurs intermittently through disturbances of organic function are undesirable. Her visits to hospital do not eliminate these troubles but only alleviate them.

It is a grace to have such blissful experiences but it is time for her to learn that realization does not end with the highly emotional conditions, but with a deepening and widening calm which if allowed will settle itself down into permanency. It will contain a measure joy and a superior understanding, a detachment from the world and yet an ability too do what has to be done with it.

So I repeat: the period of phenomena should be a temporary one, when everything is finally swallowed in a single explosion of sublime peace, great understanding and discovery once and for all, of what the cosmic void really is.

Privately I would like to say that you should urge restraint upon Mrs Ybor in these matters. Also in the matter of drinking alcohol, this is to be kept restricted.

John {Lydenfrost} who visited you last summer has made available those very beautiful pictures he took

Charles Mirra made an effort to stay in this area last summer when he visited... but suddenly decided against it and returned to California Jim Covell did likewise. However the issue is still up in the air for both. I'll do all that I can but refuse to make up their minds for them. The decision should be theirs.

Perhaps<sup>110</sup> the easiest way to get this letter off to you is by briefly writing to you about what is going on here in Ithaca at the bookstore. A small but hard core group has formed about the store and two nights a week lectures are devoted to explanation and commentary on the Hidden Teaching and the Wisdom of the Overself. A third night is devoted to a class in Astrology (bait) which by the way is being conducted by a math professor from Cornell University. Another math professor is planning to take over the Hidden Teaching class from me so that I could concentrate on other matters. In the meantime (that is while we are waiting for that final flash of illumination) Bob Hanley (alias Ramananda) is staying on with us and doing the store over as an astrologers shop. As you probably are aware Cornell University is an Ivy league college and University, with a very cosmopolitan student population numbering about twenty thousand, nearby is Ithaca College and although I am not located in the campus area (rents are prohibitive) we are close enough. We are attempting to establish ourselves as a sort of Occult Forum with some sort of Philosophic pretensions. And that is not too difficult when you become aware of the extreme intellectual degradation that has taken place in our schools. At any rate out reputation is beginning to spread and your grace is obviously operating through the activities that more and more reveal themselves as the planting of the doctrines... in a barbarous area. Strangely enough we have had the greatest difficulty in trying to get your books from Dutton & Co... And so we have been forced to seek them out elsewhere, mainly Ryder. Unfortunately paperbacks are not really very useful when it comes to the major works. Paperbacks simply will not stand up to any abuse, and when more than one reading is called for they fall apart. I understand that Weiser is taking over publication rights of your titles from Ryder.

I wish it were possible to be able to dedicate myself to writing a commentary on certain portions of The Wisdom... to find a few people who would join with me in this preliminary an effort... a co-operative effort with the greatest amplitude given to the comparative method. And thus involve them the students in depth; besides I do believe that the time has come to try and evoke even criticism to your works. From those that have visited you and returned, with water from the fountain of youth... we have been replenished and conserved

Some time ago I had a dream wherein I had a long conversation with Dr C Jung when it was almost over his face changed and you appeared... with the concluding remark that now I should understand why I had to spend so much time in these studies. Even then I was being guided... whenever I would allow it... towards ends unknown to me. For I have discovered here and there a thread that is leading me on to greater self knowledge... and delivering me from this conceptualizing self entanglement. Yet in some ways I have pushed hard, too hard to suddenly bring all my studies to a halt as you hinted at... but I am in doubt as to the meaning you implied.

From Richard I have learned that you were quite concerned about my health and suggested that he take over the class on the Hidden Teaching. Needless to say I have complied and am quite happy with the results so far... for among the many, he in particular I felt was best qualified to do so. I suspect that he has committed himself in some manner that I am unaware of... after seeing you

This of course leaves me free to do that task which constantly floats up into my consciousness... the suggestion and commentary on some sections in the Wisdom. I doubt my ability, but I have learned to doubt my doubts. The work needs being done, in turns of amplification and illustration... for the needs of this generation. generation that seems too compensate for the one previous that was determined to supress the religious function. However the present generation has been in my opinion purposely ill prepared and educated to understand the subtitles of this doctrine and least of all to grasp a creative vision when given, or presented as such without background or preparation. I consider it Jung's greatest contribution to our times... to point out how needful it is to teach people the art of seeing. "With a truly tragic delusion these theologians fail to see that it is not a matter of proving the existence of the light but of blind people who do not know that their eyes could see. that it is pointless to praise the light and preach if nobody can see it... How all this can be done without psychology... is frankly beyond my comprehension." I would like to add my feeble voice to these remarks by pointing out that the psychological immaturity with which I was confronted, and still am... I have noticed in others. And this problem becomes enormously complicated<sup>132</sup> and inflated, destructively so when someone enters the quest with-out some sort of psychological guidance. At any rate these young questers have demonstrated a genuine desire to be acquainted with a psychological knowledge that is not brought over from the behaviour of rats, on the other hand I have noticed a very high handed and a most authoritarian attitude on the part of the (among whom I include Guenon Shuon, 'Traditionalist' Pallis Burkhardt, Coomaraswamy etc) in regard to the need of psychological knowledge. Although brilliant and intuitive in their grasp of the metaphysical doctrines yet a certain rigid and inflexible collective attitude seems to dominate their affairs. Almost (to use Jungian terms) as though the archetype of the (pseudo) wise old man is living out its life

through them. I play the game and manipulate concepts accordingly... but I doubt that the implied reconciliation between activity and tranquillity has been achieved... in them.

I might add that I also include in the metaphysic class... and intend to emphasize more strongly the neo-vedantins. I have always been fascinated by the names of Shankara, Mandana, Padmapada, Suresvaracarya etc and from modern times Malkani, Bhattacharya, Sub. Iyer. We have one of the finest libraries right here at Cornell. Nor do these students fail to make use of it, especially when titles and authors are mentioned. Your works provided them with the necessary key to open the treasures locked away in vaults. Books that have not seen the light of day for maybe seventy years!

We have taken for example a paragraph or two from the Wisdom and spent weeks examining in detail its ramifications from various levels. Then comparing and corroborating from traditional sources for furthering our depth of understanding. True we keep in mind that a 'creative vision' which contains transforming power must be handled with proper reverence but we also understand that it is our understanding that gets highlighted and our knowledge that gets more inwardized.

We use even astrology to try and grasp the 'form of the soul' with the jewel significance may be in the experiences that life affords. Although the procedures are somewhat experimental the results have proved interesting. A participation in universal meaning always arouses intense interest, the projection of the understanding affords me some clue or index into the labyrinth of their mind... and from there we can go on to an exhaustive analysis of mental presuppositions which interfere in the understanding of metaphysic.

But you may ask why all this elaborate apparatus... I would simply answer that my experience has been that most who claim to understand your latter writings do so with mythological consciousness, and quite frankly I must admit that I have not met anyone (including myself) who has grasped the full import of the books. This is especially so with those students that have met you ages ago... despite the passage of years. The help has been coming through and I want to make the most use of it... a few others and myself will make the attempt to penetrate these teachings and pass it on to others, or at least share it with those that wish to

My aim is eventually establish a center for these studies... independent and in the service of jnana. Conceited! Ambitious! I hope to be excused on the grounds of devotion

Anyway I have spilled out some motives that I am aware of... perhaps there is more in the background

It seems an act of unkindness to burden you with this epistle, but it does <u>not</u> need to be answer unless you decide otherwise

Perhaps you have a desire to hear of the new location that the store has? It seems to be a compromise between your suggestions and the circumstances around. It has a very nice appearance, panel walls, florescent lighting, three bathrooms, tile floor and ceiling, central air conditioning etc. And best of all the rent is very, unbelievably low. I doubt that it could be duplicated. One hundred and seventy five dollars monthly. Last year the store started making money and except for the month when we moved, has been steadily doing so. We may very well be over the hump. Since Steve is much more practical in these matters, he is in complete charge. My concern is with bringing in better and better titles, a carefully selected list.

The classes are restricted to a floating thirty... (each class) consider all toll about One hundred people but out of that perhaps seventy or so are really concerned. We do not water down any of the teaching... many find the metaphysic class too difficult and are turned away; that cannot be helped if they are not willing to transcendently reflect and deepen their point of view with the aid of the Hidden Teaching. Mr Platek is very thorough and places the preliminary portions within their grasp, the rest is up to them The standards will be raised and not lowered

Last week I was interviewed on T.V., a half hour show on astrology, many claimed that the content of the show was above their head but the M.C. and producer highly approved and thought it was time for a meaningful expose, and that the psychological level was extremely interesting. Suggested a return... I attempted a reintegration of our fragmentary understanding of astrology back into metaphysical principles

Romain visited us for a short and quick week only to take off again, she is expected to return next week. Her extreme sensitivity will require all the tact I can bring, perhaps here more than with anyone else the feeling arises that I am anticipating in my imagination a future development.

The most difficult part of my job is now in the winter the travelling to and fro, for the rest it is that part of the year where I have some leisure to dream and study and especially during the long winter nights when I can sit in front of my fireplace and lovingly recall those glorious days I spent with you in Montauk, hardly appreciating them

I have been invited by the people in Ohio to visit them for a few days and have informal discussions on some aspects of mentalism. I am in the process of making arrangements. There is one person in particular a Mrs Dorothy French that frightens me. She is determined and has so expressed herself with a notion to build a center devoted to the 'higher purposes' At first I was amused, but latter informed by some others that she is known to keep her promises and be of an iron will. When speaking to her I had the very distinct feeling that here was an old soul and yet she hardly seemed to possess any artistic temperament, she is known as an artist... portrait painter of considerable skill. My confusion gets confounded... she is hardly what I would call a student, as of now she is engaged in making money by going into some sort of commercial enterprise, the selling of household articles already she is in the thirty thousand dollars a year bracket. And plans to get together a few hundred thousand to actualize her project. She further insisted that I will have to be a member, I'm flattered and dazed. I enjoy and am happy here, besides Columbus is a huge city... but I believe that my real {dejection} is otherwise. I do not wish - in these matters - to be under the thumb of those people who are concerned with matters other than self-knowledge. I find it difficult to believe
