Editor's Note: This file should be considered alongside "PB's Library." This file was in use until 1980, the year before PB's death. I know, because I worked on it (and nearly lost it at the Lausanne library). There are many fragmentary or dated references we were unable to clarify, but we were able to improve the clarity of the document. We wrote out many of the abbreviations, since PB did not always use the same form for those abbreviations. A tricky one is "biblio" which can refer to "bibliography" or the French word for library – "bibliotheque." Some of the entries were marked by an 'x' and some by a circled 'x' (\otimes); these indicate books that PB found at some point. The entries marked with \otimes appear to all relate to the large library in Lausanne, Switzerland which PB visited frequently regardless of which small Swiss town he was living in. Sometime PB marked an entry with LNE for "Lausanne Library" or UNIV LNE for the library at the University of Lausanne. Some of these were further marked with \otimes LNE reminding PB that the book could be read at the Lausanne Library. Many of the entries have three letters, or a series of letters and numbers; these are the various forms of internal reference identities used in the libraries and have no real relevance to the books themselves.

PB also marked some pages as "Lending Library List" or "Lending List." The former is clear enough: many of the libraries he visited (including the ones in Lausanne) only allowed their patrons to read the books in the building; a library that let you take a book home was fairly rare, and those were called Lending Libraries. The "Lending List" pages could also refer to such a library or possibly to books which PB had on hand and which he was willing to lend out. We know that PB had a personal library of several thousand titles at the time of his death, so it is possible he kept some record of lending books, or of books he planned to lend.

We have opted to make the default heading "Lib List." If there is a different heading on the original page we have made that a subheader under "Lib List." We have indicated whenever the subheader ends and the pages revert to the default heading by inserting a new "Lib List" header. We have titled the last section "Handwritten Entries for Lib List" as the pages are almost exclusively PB's handwritten notes from the 1960s and 70s, many referring to libraries in Switzerland. A few have notes by myself, when I was doing research for PB in Lausanne, and those are noted as such. Since there is little to no text here, we did not introduce our para-page identifiers and instead refer to the sections as "entries." Names and titles have only been checked for spelling if the typing was unclear in the original or a spelling change was made (to determine if the change was correct or not). Otherwise, except for instances where a comment has been left or the name/title has been inserted in curly brackets, names/titles have been typed as they appear.

Her religious calm was shattered by the discovery that her confessor Molinos was a heretic and guilty of sexual aberrations with his women devotees."³ (1) Queen Christina believed in religious freedom and lack of racial prejudice. (2) A boundless
